
# Career Pathways Program Newsletter April 2023

The Career Pathways Program has partnered with several teams in MCPS, and an outside consultant to develop a comprehensive leadership development program. This program consists of two pathways, both of which will provide employees with an opportunity for quality professional development, meaningful networking opportunities, and more.

In order to participate in this program, employees must:

- be a permanent supporting services employees
- have at least 5 years experience with MCPS
- have worked in their current position for a minimum of 1 year
- have supervisor approval

Interested individuals will complete a form to indicate their interest and the Career Pathways Team will hold short, informal interviews to select the a cohort of approximately 30 participants for each pathway. The deadline to apply will be **June 3, 2023**.

# Early Childhood Alternative Certification Program (ECACP) at Montgomery College

Montgomery County Public Schools and Montgomery College have partnered to offer a teacher preparation program for individuals who wish to become certified early childhood educators (Pre-K through 3rd grade). Montgomery College will hold several virtual information sessions for interested individuals to learn more.

Candidates must have:

- A bachelor's degree\*
- Experience in the early childhood education field
- A 3.0 overall minimum GPA on their most recently earned degree OR qualifying scores on basic skills requirements.
