Reporting Your Child Absent from School

Since we are required to file written documentation from parents on absences, please follow up with a written note if you call an absence into the office. Click here for a shell for your use.

About your child's attendance: we are required to inform parents of the attendance status for students. If your child is absent 10% or more, we will notify you in writing. These attendance letters are intended to be informative. If there is further action required, we will follow up with you directly. Please know that we understand that children get sick and must stay home from school. We never expect you to send your child to school if they are ill. In fact, we appreciate you doing your part in keeping the school community healthy by not sending your child to school if they have a fever or other significant symptoms that suggest they are sick and need to rest and recover rather than being in school. Kindergarten & Pre-school Education Program News



Kindergarten Orientation for the Fall 2023 Kindergarten Class will be held on Thursday and Friday, May 4 - 5 2023. *Current kindergarten students will not attend school on these days*. More information about registering your child for kindergarten for Fall, 2023 will be sent home very soon.



We are happy to announce that we will be accepting applications for *Community Student Peers* for our Preschool Education Program (PEP) for the 2023-2024 school year. PEP offers pre kindergarten classes and services for children with disabilities ages 3–5 in an early childhood setting for children with and without disabilities. If you choose to enroll your child, he/she will be in an inclusive class with other students with and without disabilities. Classes are 5 days per week for

2.5 hours per day. The cost is \$150 per semester or \$300 per year. The class is taught by a certified MCPS teacher. There is a para educator in the class to assist. The class follows a PreK Curriculum. Priority is given to children that reside in the local school boundary. Your child must be 3 years old on or before the first day of school for PEP (please check the MCPS website for the official start date. It is usually a week after school starts for grades K-5). Due to the anticipated high numbers of applicants, enrollment will be based on a lottery system. Applications will be accepted through the month of March and assignments will be made in late April. You will be contacted in late April or early May if you are awarded placement in the program. Although a wait list will be created with the names of applicants not originally placed, please have backup plans for Preschool, as there are a limited number of openings.
