

Mentoring for All: Strategies, Activities, and Assessment

TOT-02 (Elementary & Secondary)

Audience: Veteran teachers, administrators, or supporting service staff wanting to mentor others in MCPS.

This 3-MSDE credit course will focus on the content knowledge and skills needed to mentor a colleague whether he/she is a principal, teacher, supporting services or central services employee. Participants will examine, learn, practice and understand numerous equitable classroom practices related to mentoring, coaching, and collaboration. Opportunities will be provided to establish a network of collegial relationships and engage in problem solving to support professional growth and student learning. Blackboard will be used in lieu of on-site classes for five weeks to enhance the digital component of the course.



Dates: Fall semester runs October – January.
Spring semester runs February – June.
Summer sessions run June & August.

Time: During the regular school year, classes are usually held one evening per week for three hours (for example from 4:00 to 7:00 p.m.) over a 15 week period. Blackboard is used in lieu of on-site classes for five of the 15 weeks.
During the summer semester, classes are usually day-long or about six hours per day for one week.
