The MCPSRA-PAC is charged with the task of interviewing candidates running for public office and making recommendations to the membership as to whom the committee believes would best advocate for our issues.

The 2010 election cycle will be very busy as there are over 40 different offices which are up for election in Montgomery County: U.S. House and Senate, Governor, all 32 Montgomery County Senators and Delegates, County Executive, all nine members of the County Council and four Board of Education members. NOT ANOTHER REALITY SHOW!

Are you a TV watcher? If so, then you are well aware that the premise or theme of many of the new shows in recent years has centered on what the writers and producers consider realities of everyday life: the trials and tribulations of big city housewives, brave souls abandoned on some exotic and dangerous island trying to survive, chefs that compete to be the best at preparing an entrée that very few of us recognize or can pronounce, dress designers who create ensembles that none of us would be caught dead trying on let alone wearing anywhere in public, millionaire bachelors seeking to find the perfect wife, and the list of such “reality” shows continues to grow almost monthly. Are any of you hooked on them or are you like many others that scream, “PLEASE! Not another reality show!”

How many of you really can relate to these programs as real situations in your own lives? Probably not many. Maybe it is time to redefine what is true reality in the world around us. When we watch the news of earthquake-ravaged Haiti and Chile, we can see with our own eyes what these dear people are going through. We realize just how much they will need our help in the months and years to come just to survive and to rebuild their lives and homes. Look at how readily people all around the world have sent donations of food, clothing, medical supplies, and personnel, as well as millions in monetary contributions to come to these people’s aid. It truly defines us all as a human community full of caring, compassion, and commitment to one another no matter where in this world we reside.

Does it take an earth-shattering disaster to get us to focus on the realities in our lives? It shouldn’t. Let’s seriously evaluate what is true reality in the lives of many Montgomery County residents, especially their children. With the state of our national economy in the last year or so, more and more individuals here in our own county have joined the ranks of the unemployed, of those who have faced or may face foreclosure on their homes, of those who can barely provide food and clothing for their families. How many are there? Do we really need to know the number? They are far more than a statistic – they are members of the human community that are in desperate need of our caring and our help. Rise to the challenge and join our association’s seven-year quest and dedication to helping the needy school children in our county by donating to the **Toolkits, Books, and Backpacks Project**.

Why is our plea seem so desperate at this time when the project doesn’t come to fruition until the end of June? It takes a year’s efforts to raise the necessary funds (at least \$25,000) to enable us to provide approximately 1500 toolkits to needy Title I kindergartners as well as some 1600 books for children in other grades and 40 backpacks for homeless children. To date for this year, we have only received around \$5,500 in donations compared to over \$8,000 at this same time last year. We are very concerned that our project is in jeopardy if we cannot gain support from our members in the form of sponsorship donations. If a trip has to be cancelled because of insufficient numbers of participants needed by the deadline as published, your check will be returned to you. Feel free to call to find out if your reservation and payment were received.
10. Refunds are made only when your space can be filled.
11. Gratuities for driver and local guides are not included in the price of the trip.

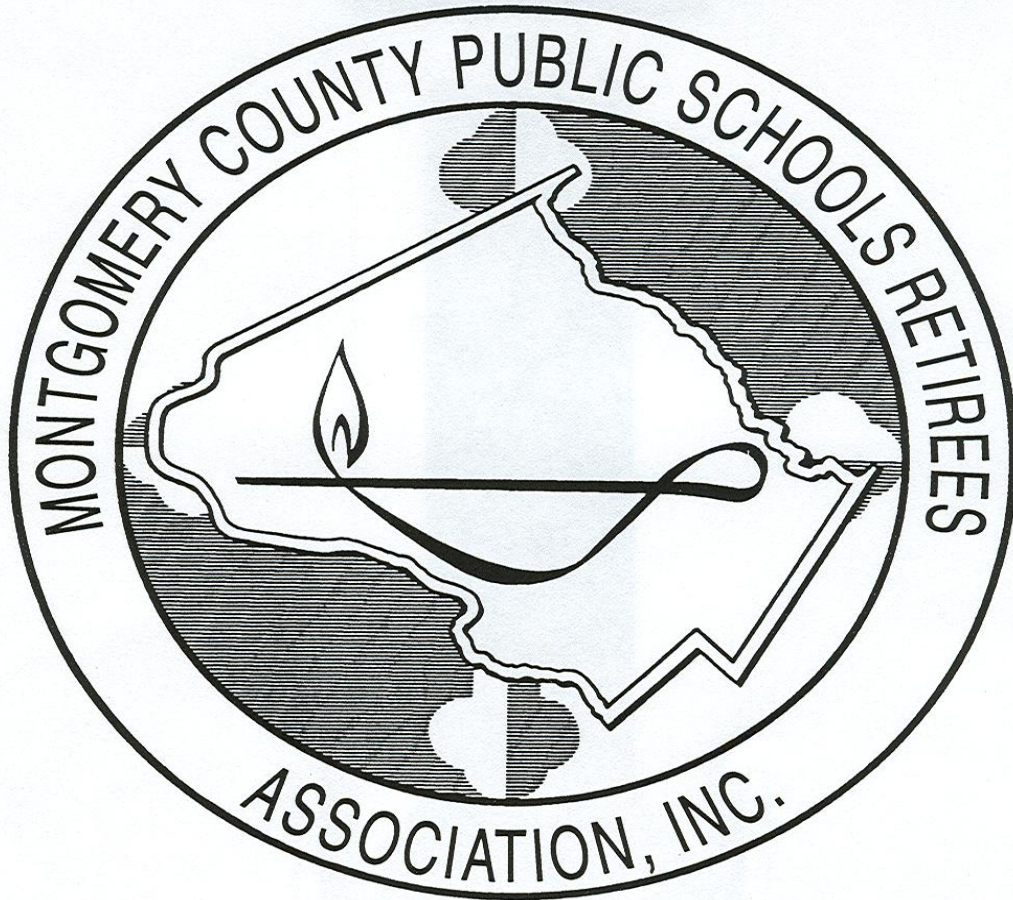

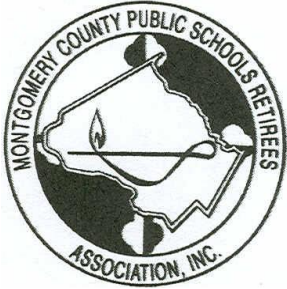
