

MCJC MEMBERSHIP INVOLVEMENT AWARD



Throughout the year, schools earn points towards recognition for being an active member of the Montgomery County Junior Councils. The school with the most cumulative points or all schools earning 60 or more points will receive special recognition at the MCJC Awards Program.

1. Joined MCJC in September = 10 points (Oct = 8; Nov = 6; Dec = 4; Jan = 2)
2. Represented at MCJC general assemblies = 2 points for each GA that delegates attended (10 points maximum)
3. Represented at MCJC executive board meetings (schools are expected to have the SGA president or liaison attend executive board meetings) = 2 points for each exbd that the president, liaison, or other school representative attended (10 points maximum)
4. Student serving in a staff position for MCJC= 2 points for every officer or staff member – this does not include school presidents/liasons (10 points maximum)
5. Attended the Annual Board of Education meeting with Student Leaders = 2 points for every student (10 points maximum)
6. Hosted a general assembly (MASC event or other MCJC special event) = 10 points (20 points maximum)
7. Representative on the Special Elections Committee = 2 points for every meeting a student(s) serving attended (10 points maximum) (MCJC Special Elections Director position does not count towards his/her school points)
8. Participation in the MCJC and/or MASC selected charity (10 points maximum)
9. Student testified at a BOE meeting (County Council, MD legislative committee, etc.) = 2 points for every student and/or student attended the Board of Education meeting for the Student Leadership Week Recognition (10 points maximum)
10. Student serving on a county (state/national) committee, taskforce, workgroup, etc. = 2 points for every student (10 points maximum)

*Note: MCJC staff cannot be counted for # 2, #3, and #5

Although the Student Affairs Office has records of students serving on most county/state committees (Public Library, Recreation Department, Curriculum Advisory Assembly, Shared Accountability, Mark Mann, Teen Advisory Council, etc.), the student government advisors should email a list of students and the county-level or state-level committee on which they serve to Karen_L_Crawford@mcpsmd.org in order to ensure that full points are awarded for category #10.
