

Homecoming Court

- **SUMMARY**

- This project is to nominate and select Homecoming King, Queen, Princesses, and Princes. We help the student winners get a boost in self esteem and to give the students an opportunity to show their appreciation for the most worthy students.

- **OBJECTIVES**

- To bring a sense of pride to the student winners and to let the other students recognize their fellow classmates that they respect and look up to the most.

- **ACTIVITIES**

- Help homecoming chair order all crowns and tiaras and sashes for the winners. All freshman-junior winners get sashes. All senior runner-ups get sashes. The king and queen get crowns/tiaras and scepters. The queen gets a large bouquet of roses. The runner-ups, princesses, get a smaller bouquet or roses.
- We get our roses from Mom's, a flower shop. You need 6 bouquets of 6 roses, for all the freshman-junior winners than all the senior runner-ups. Than 1 bouquet of 12 roses for the queen.
- Make original ballots for all 4 classes.
- 3 empty slots for a girl. 3 empty slots for a boy.
- On top of ballot write out rules, only once person on each line. Must have first and last name. Must be in your grade.
- Grades 9-11 homecoming prince and princess.
- Grade 12 homecoming king and queen.
- Count ballots to narrow down the top 3 girls and boys for each class.
- Only SGA advisor/teachers can count them. NO STUDENTS may count ballots.
- Make an announcement on the morning announcements about who the runner-ups are.
- Make second ballot with the 3 contestant's names, boy and girl, for each grade. Again have the rules up top. Only circle on person for each. Say when the final winners will be announced.
- Again count these ballots and only the SGA Advisor/other teachers can count them. ABSOLUTLY no students may count.
- Send passes out to ALL the runner-ups and winners to come early to the Pep Rally. Do not tell them who won on the pass.
- At the pep rally call out all the runner-ups and winner from the freshman class. Couple them up. Then announce the winner.
- Do this again for sophomore class and junior class.
- Call up the senior class but do NOT announce them at the pep rally. Announce them at the homecoming football game.

- **RESULTS**

- Homecoming Court turned out amazing because the crowns, tiaras, sashes, and flowers all came in and were what we wanted. Also the Homecoming Court members were well behaved and held themselves very well when they won.

Homecoming Football Game

- **SUMMARY**

- This is a time when we play a Homecoming Game and again call the Homecoming court and give them more flowers and more time to be honored.

- **OBJECTIVES**

- To give the Blake Bengals a chance to get up the Homecoming spirit by winning a game and honoring the Homecoming Court winners by announcing them at the game and giving them more flowers, crowns, tiaras, and letting them have an escort.

- **ACTIVITIES**

- Email the Announcer of the football games, Mr. Murfin, with a script to use at half time.
- The scripts must have the winners of each class. Freshmen first, then sophomores, and then juniors.
- Each winner gets to choose their own escort. Make sure they tell you who the escort is at the pep rally so you can give the name to the announcer in time.
- When the winners walk out onto the field the girls get flowers and the sash, boys just get the sash.
- Once freshmen-juniors are called you call the seniors.
- Introduce all contestants and they also each get to bring their own escort.
- Again girls get flowers, a small tiara and sash boys just get a sash.
- Then announce the winners and when announced give the queen a larger bouquet of roses and the tiara and scepter. And give the king his crown and his scepter.
- Then once everyone is done clapping for them they leave the field. However RE COLLECT all sashes, crowns, and tiaras. You will re give these out at Homecoming dance for the picture and then they may keep them.
