## Frequently Asked Questions About the Program and Volunteering

### What is ELO SAIL?

Extended Learning Opportunities Summer Adventures in Learning (ELO SAIL) is a Montgomery County Public Schools (MCPS) instructional program designed to help students at federally funded Title I schools who are entering kindergarten through Grade 5 to improve their reading and mathematics skills. The program reinforces what children already know and will be learning in upcoming school year. Several schools also offer arts and recreation programs in the afternoon. Breakfast and lunch are provided for K-5 ELO SAIL students and volunteers under the age of 18 years old.

## Afternoon Volunteer Opportunities

The 21st Century Community Learning Center (21st CCLC) is an afternoon arts and recreation program for students enrolled in 8 ELO SAIL schools. This afternoon program is a collaborative effort with the Montgomery County Arts and Humanities Council and the Montgomery County Department of Recreation, the City of Rockville, and the City of Gaithersburg. Volunteers for the 21st CCLC program (6 per site) will assist students with arts and recreation activities at the following elementary schools:

### Who is eligible to be a volunteer?

Interested adults as well as college, high school, and middle school students are eligible to apply.

### What kind of time commitment do I have to make?

A consistent weekly time commitment for the month-long session is most beneficial to the ELO SAIL students and program. Please note on your application the hours each week that you are available to volunteer.

### Can I choose the school and grade level?

Every effort will be made to place you in a school and/or the grade level you desire. However, your flexibility is appreciated.

### Will there be a volunteer training?

Yes, participation in one ELO SAIL volunteer training or orientation session is required. New volunteers will learn about supporting classroom instruction and

understanding MCPS volunteer policies. Training for new ELO SAIL volunteers are offered in June.

Returning volunteers will attend a refresher orientation on either the first or second day of ELO SAIL at the assigned school.

You will be notified of the assigned training or orientation date in the ELO SAIL volunteer confirmation letter.

### What is the application process?

Potential volunteers must complete and return a 2009 ELO SAIL application. If you are accepted you will be notified in writing of your school placement and training or orientation date and time. Confirmation letters will be mailed in June.
