

### Course Objectives

- Define traditional folk, classical, and pop music
- Discover the impact of slavery on American music
- Create a journal to create an awareness of individual music experiences
- Use the elements of music to explore the music of Africa, India, and Latin America
- Perform traditional folk music from various cultures/countries through singing and playing on percussion instruments
- Explore musicians who combine music styles from various cultures to create new styles of popular music

### Grading Policy

*The following categories make the total of a student's grade:*

1. **20% Homework:** this may include collecting music samples for class presentations, and completing research for projects
2. **25% Class Assignments:** including worksheets, journaling, and peer critiques
3. **10% Performance Assessments:** singing and playing instruments
4. **25% Quizzes and Written Assessments:** listening to music to identify a musical concept, brief constructed responses, as well as true/false, multiple choice, and fill in the blank
5. **20% Projects:** involving research, and class presentations
