Thank you to all of you who visited during our annual Open House last week. We heard many positive comments on all the excellent teaching and learning that is happening at Goshen ES. The students especially enjoyed having their parents join them for part of the day.

Our annual Halloween parties and parade will be held on October 30. Our parade will start at 2:00 p.m. and classroom parties will follow. As your child/children plan their costumes, please keep this guideline in mind: *No props that are weapons (even "pretend") such as knives or guns should be brought to school.* We also ask that your child not dress in costumes that portray violence or are extremely frightening. We want this afternoon to be fun and enjoyable for all, including our younger students and visitors. Students should wear regular school clothes on that day and bring their costume to school in a bag. There will be time to change into costumes before the parade begins. If you do not want your child to participate in the Halloween activities, please notify your child's teacher. We will provide an alternate activity.
