**The Kingsview Middle School After School Activity Programs will begin on September 29, 2009 and conclude on May 27, 2010.**

- **Signing the Permission Form acknowledges that you are agreeing to the terms and conditions set by the Montgomery County Public Schools and Kingsview Middle School regarding every student's rights and responsibilities to participate in activities after school hours.**
- **Signing the Permission Form also acknowledges that you are permitting your son/daughter to attend an activity or activities sponsored by Kingsview Middle School, Montgomery County Public Schools, Montgomery County Department of Recreation, and their staff members.**
  1. All students that participate in activities at Kingsview Middle School must abide by all set rules and regulations in the handbook they received at the beginning of the school year.
  2. NO phone calls will be allowed using the school office phones. Please have all students make arrangements prior to attending the activity. There is a pay phone located outside the main entrance.
  3. Students must remain in only one activity for the duration of the after school program each day. They MAY NOT roam the halls or switch activities during the after school time period. Any student found in the halls without permission will be asked to sit in the front hall or be asked to leave for the remainder of the afternoon.
  4. All students must be in their sponsored activity by 2:50pm and may not leave without permission before 4:10pm.
  5. Students must obtain an activity bus pass from the sponsor of the activity. This pass must be presented to the bus driver before boarding the activity bus. Students will not be allowed to take the activity bus without this pass. In addition, students who are absent the day of an after school or evening activity may not participate in the activity. Students who go to the community center MAY NOT ride the activity bus.
  6. All students must meet the Academic Eligibility requirements. Please read below.

The MCPS policy establishing eligibility standards for participation in extracurricular activities is very clear (Policy IQD, Regulation IQR-RD for Middle School Students). In summary, it reads: The policy will not apply to 1<sup>st</sup> quarter for 6<sup>th</sup> grade students or any student entering MCPS schools for the first time. It also does not apply to students engaged in activities which are extensions of a graded course. Students in grade 6-12 must maintain a 2.0 grade point average with no more than one "E" in the previous marking period to be eligible to participate in the listed activities. A student's report card will state whether they are eligible for extracurricular activities.

**7. You MUST PAY the Extracurricular Activities (ECA) Fee. Please read below for payment information and procedures.**

Montgomery County Public Schools (MCPS) requires a fee for all middle school and high school students interested in participating in extracurricular activities. This yearly fee of \$30 covers all activities that a student may choose to participate in during school year. An extracurricular activity is defined as any activity for which there is an adult supervising students beyond the instructional day in a school-sponsored activity. \*A fee is not required for students receiving academic assistance such as intervention clubs and math help.

Pre-printed extracurricular Activity Fee (ECA) forms are available in the main office or on the MCPS website <http://www.mcps.k12.md.us/departments/forms/pdf/280-37.pdf> (you must have adobe acrobat) Payment should be sent directly to the address listed on the form (please, do NOT send payment to the school). **There will be no refunds.**

There is a sliding fee based on household income. It is as follows:

- Household income greater than \$35,000 -- Fee \$30.00
- Household income less than \$35,000 – Fee \$15.00 (you must send proof of income)
