

The Kingsview Letter Student Recognition Program



Awards

200 Points = Kingsview Letter

350 Points = Bar Pin

500 Points = Star Pin

650 Points = Special Award

All students have the opportunity to earn a Kingsview Letter and pins for their accomplishments, service, and extra-curricular participation during their years at Kingsview Middle School. Earning a Kingsview Letter is a special honor.

Students begin earning points in sixth grade and accumulate points throughout eighth grade. Students earn points for academics, club participation, athletics, service, competitions, etc. The more involved a student is, the more points he or she accumulates toward earning a letter or pin. Many of the ways a student can earn points are listed on the back.

It is the responsibility of the student to keep a record of his/her points throughout their Kingsview years. Points must be submitted in the school year in which they are earned. Students are required to submit the form annually to the Kingsview Student Relationships & Character Counts Committee. Responsibilities

Student

- Maintain personal points record sheet
- Request teacher/sponsor signatures for points earned

Parents

- Encourage participation in the Kingsview Letter Program

Staff/Club Sponsor

- Provide forms for students
- Review the guidelines for the Kingsview Letter and make students aware of opportunities.
- Remind students to request signatures quarterly or after the activity and sign forms upon request
- Submit the record sheet annually to the Kingsview grade-level coordinator by the deadline

- Provide a communication link for the community and advertise the program
