FLU MIST FOR STUDENTS SUSPENDED

The Montgomery Council Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) has suspended the seasonal flu clinics scheduled in the remaining 56 elementary schools from October 5 – October 22 until further notice. Therefore, RCES will not conduct the flu clinic that was scheduled on October 14. If you wish to obtain seasonal flu vaccines for your child/ren, injectable seasonal flu vaccine will be available for students at the School Health Services Center, MCPS Rocking Horse Road Center, 4910 Macon Road, Rockville, M D 20852 on Thursdays, 8:30 a.m.- 12:30 p.m. and 1:30 p.m. - 3:30 p.m., and open to everyone at county flu clinics on October 31, at Silver Spring Health Center 10:00 a.m.- 2:00 p.m.; on November 5, at Germantown Recreational Center, 8:30 a.m.- 12:00 p.m.; and on November 12, at University of Maryland, Shady Grove, 4:00 p.m.- 7:00 p.m.

Please continue to practice general precautions for prevention of flu by covering coughs and sneezes, washing hands frequently, and avoid touching your eyes, nose and mouth. It is important to stay at home when sick with flu-like symptoms (fever 100 F or greater with a cough and/or sore throat). Children should be fever-free for 24 hours before returning to school.

RACHEL CARSON HELP THE HOMELESS WALK

Once again, Rachel Carson Elementary School (RCES) will participate in the Fannie Mae Foundation Walk for the Homeless. The walk will take place on Friday, October 30, in conjunction with our Halloween parade. This is not a separate walk and the children will still wear their Halloween costumes. This is a wonderful opportunity for our students to make a difference for the families-in-need in our community. RCES will walk to raise money for Gaithersburg HELP, an all-volunteer organization that helps area residents in need of food, prescriptions, transportation for medical services, as well as diapers and formula. Last year, RCES had 113 registered walkers who participated, and we raised \$1,705 for Gaithersburg HELP. PUMPKIN ESTIMATION

Once again this year, Peter and Paula Pumpkin will soon be visiting RCES (starting Oct. 19)! Peter and Paula will be on display near the main office. Children will have an opportunity to estimate the weight of Peter and Paula throughout the rest of the month of October. The student who estimates the correct weight (or closest weight) of Peter and Paula will take the pumpkin home after our Halloween festivities. Children in grades K-3 will estimate the weight of one of our pumpkins in pounds and ounces, and students in grades 4 and 5 will have an opportunity to estimate the weight of our other pumpkin in kilograms. This would be a great time to discuss pounds, ounces and kilograms with your children at home. This activity reinforces the concept of estimation taught in math and science.



HALLOWEEN COSTUMES

In a few weeks we will be celebrating Halloween, and children will be wearing their costumes in our annual Halloween Parade. Please discourage your child from wearing any costume that depicts violence to school. **Items that will not be permitted at school are those that resemble weapons.** This includes **metal fingers, knives, guns, etc. (even paper replicas)**. This is in keeping with the MCPS weapons policy and our goal of providing our children with an appropriate model of a safe school environment. Please remind your child that these items are not to be brought to school. This request will be strictly enforced.



For children who do not celebrate Halloween, a flyer will be sent home for parents to complete and return indicating that they would prefer their child be involved in an alternate activity during the parade and parties.
