## NEW Scholarships for the 2009/2010 Academic Year

The Greater Washington Chapter of the Organization of Chinese Americans (OCA-DC) is now accepting applications for 2009 Scholarship Awards Competition. Students must be a high school junior or senior and be self identified as having Asian or Pacific Islander heritage.
