Stonegate Protests Budget Cuts — No More Fat to Trim!

In early April, the Montgomery County Council held a series of hearings on next year's county budget, which contains funding for public schools. Stonegate was represented at the hearings and submitted a comment letter that was presented to Council members. In our letter, we note our grave concern about the staff reductions planned for our school next year, which we fear will lead to unacceptably large class sizes and be a threat to continued progress for our students.

Our letter notes that we have lost a crucial math support position which has served to reduce class sizes in compacted and accelerated math courses, and has allowed us to offer a Math 7 course to qualifying fifth graders. Our letter also indicates that our work with struggling readers may be jeopardized due to cuts in paraeducator and reading initiative teacher time. We cite as particularly worrisome the experience with our third grade classes, which have 29/30 students each. We note that without the math support teacher, their math classes will be severely crowded next year.

We urge the County Council not to make any additional cuts to the

MCPS budget, as "there is simply no more fat to trim at Stonegate."

As we await adoption of the final county budget, principal Audra Fladung continues to collaborate with staff and parents to develop a master schedule for next year that best meets the needs of all our students. The PTA stands willing to assist in any way possible during these trying budget times.

Dealing with Strangers and Other Dangers

A stranger is a person whom you have never met. You may have seen the person before but don't know anything about him or her. Strangers don't look like monsters, aliens, or the bad guys you see on TV. They look like ordinary people.

What's the big deal? Well, most strangers are nice, but some are not. You can't tell if a stranger is nice or not by looking at him or her. But you can tell if a situation is good or bad — you should:

- Be aware of dangerous situations: If a stranger asks you for help or to keep a "special secret," it could be a dangerous situation; say no and tell a trusted adult.
- Trust your instincts: If you feel scared or uncomfortable, get away from the situation; make an excuse or just run away and go to a safe place.
- Know what to do: Think No, Go, Yell, Tell. If you're in a dangerous situation, say no, run away, yell as loud as you can, and tell an adult.
- Ask your parents first: If a stranger invites you to go somewhere, offers you a gift, or just wants to talk, say you need to ask your parents for permission first.
- * Stick with friends: It's always safer to play in a group.

Parents and children should discuss the following questions.

- Who is a stranger?
A person that you and your parents do not know.
- How might a stranger try to fool you into getting into their car?
By telling you that your parents couldn't come so he/she was sent to give you a ride home.
- How can you protect yourself?
By asking the person to give you the family's secret code word.
- What is a secret family code word used for?
To let you know that it is safe for someone to pick you up.
- What should you do if someone brought a package to your house when you're home alone?
Speak to him/her through a closed door, telling them your mom/dad is resting and cannot come to the door. Tell them to leave the package on the porch.
- Is it safe to accept gifts from strangers?
NO!
- If a stranger stops their car near you and asks for directions, what should you do?
Stand at a good distance from the car, even if they ask you to come closer.
- If you become separated from your family at a store or mall, what should you do?
Tell someone who works in the store that you are lost. DO NOT WANDER.
- What should you do if someone

grabs you and starts taking you out of the store?

Yell, "I don't know you!" and keep it up.

- In an emergency, how can you call the police or fire?
Dial 9-1-1.
- If you come home to an empty house after school, what is the first thing you should do?
Lock all the doors.

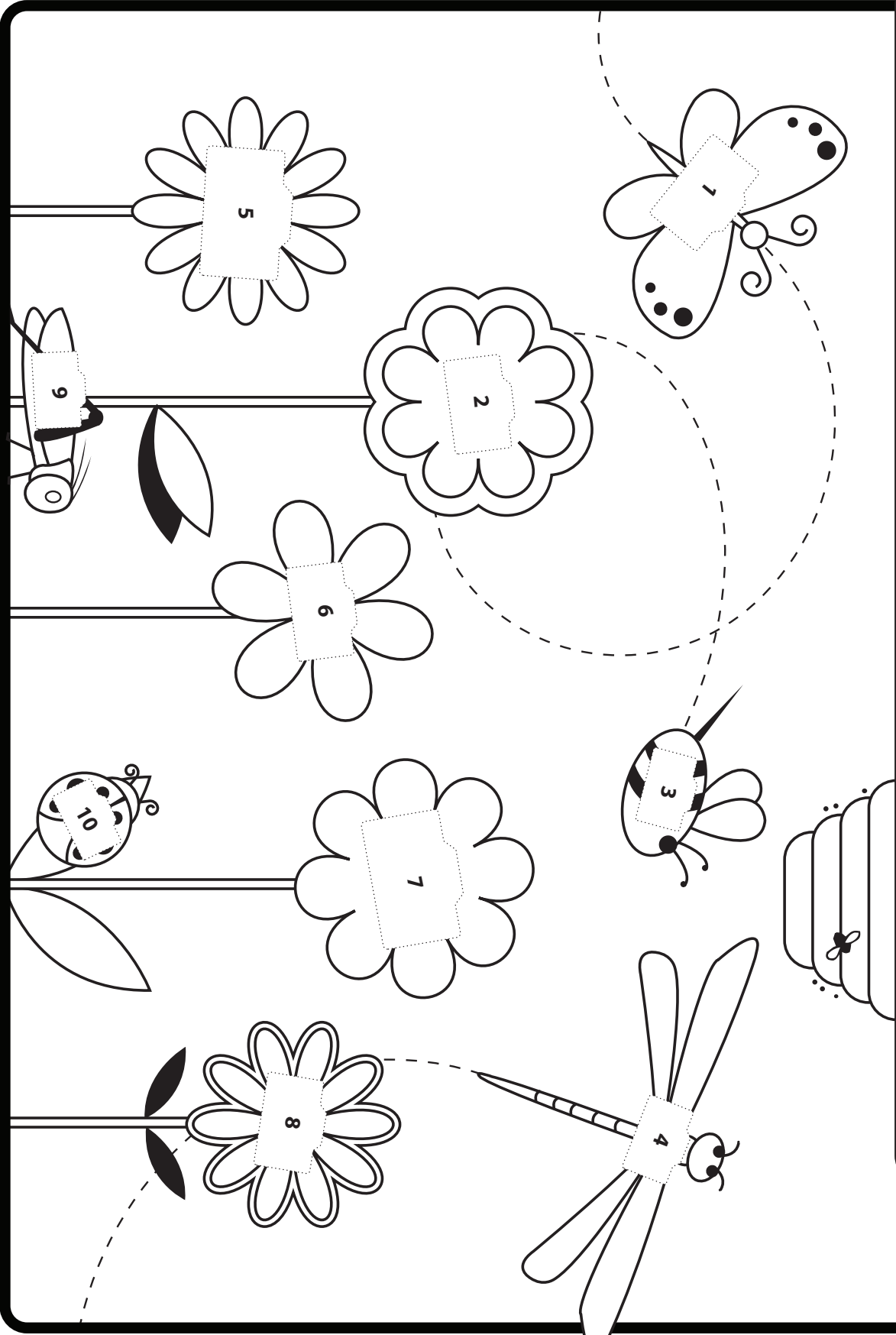
