### Prekindergarten Special Education in Montgomery County

A recent Board of Education update revealed that Montgomery County Public Schools (MCPS) continues to respond to the increasing needs among children ages birth through 5 years who qualify for special education services. In FY 2010, 4,417 students with disabilities or devel-

opmental delays received individualized support with the Montgomery County Infants and Toddlers Program or in a prekindergarten special education program. This represents an increase of more than 27% over a five-year period.

An array of special education services is available to better prepare young learners for success in school. The Montgomery County Council of Parent Teacher Associations has a subcommittee that works to ensure the timely and appropriate implementation of laws for the education of children with special needs. The subcommittee supports the local school committees and serves as a resource on MCPS alternative programs.

What is special education? It is the education of students with special needs in a way that addresses their individual requirements and differences. Special needs come in different forms such as attention deficit disorder, autism, dyslexia, physical disabilities, developmental disorders, behavioral disorders, etc. Most children with these needs have Individualized Education Plans or 504 plans (A plan under section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act and the Americans with Disabilities Act, which spells out the modifications and accommodations that will be needed for students with special needs to have an opportunity perform at the same level as their peers).

Special education involves individually planned and systematically

monitored arrangement of teaching procedures, adapted equipment and materials, accessible settings, and other interventions designed to help learners with special needs achieve a higher level of self-sufficiency and success in school and community than would be possible if the students only had access to typical classroom education.

## Ask Mrs. Berning

Remember, many other parents may have the same question and everyone benefits when YOU ask.

*Parent: My child is really shy, how can he/she make friends?*

**Mrs. Berning:** Children are shy in various ways. Knowing the nature of your child's shyness will help you identify the specific skills your child needs to be more at ease in social situations. There are many ways you can help:

**Teach social skills early:** Arrange play dates for your children and seek out safe places for them to interact with others and practice social skills. Schedule an etiquette day once a week/month/quarter, during which you practice social skills as a family — from setting the table and the proper use of tableware to saying hello, shaking hands, and introducing family members to one another.

**Emphasize creative problem-solving:** Shy kids tend to worry a lot and are afraid of failure. Give your children the ability to see problems as challenges and failures as feedback. Strengthen their confidence and encourage them to keep on trying. Teach your children to think cre-

atively — show them how to brainstorm and generate more than one solution for their problems.

**Role model confident social behavior:** Children learn by watching the people around them. Parents, your ability to approach others and put them at ease can help put your children at ease, too. Help your children learn by making positive comments about how you felt while you approached others — "I thought that would be harder than it was," "That wasn't much fun, but I'm glad I got it out of the way," "That didn't go well but at least I know what to do next time."

Help your children identify talents and hobbies that make them feel special: The more we do, the more interesting we become to ourselves and other people. Encourage your children to develop passions early in life. The more things your children do and love, the more they will have to share with others and the easier it will be for them to connect.

**Help your children learn to manage their emotions:** Encourage your children to feel what they feel. Never tell them it's wrong to cry or feel a certain way. Teach your children to know their emotions, accept them as natural, know that hurt doesn't last forever and that they can learn the skills to cope. Feelings, like traffic lights, direct our lives. When they're green, it's good and business as usual. When they're yellow, we may be feeling a bit shaky and it's best to slow down and proceed with caution. But should they turn red, it's a sign that something isn't working and it's best to stop and rethink.

**Teach tolerance and respect for others:** Shy people are notoriously judgmental, both of themselves and others. When shy children overhear parents criticizing other people's hair,

wardrobe, job, lifestyle or personality, they assume that's what everyone does and assume that going out in public means you will be continuously judged. Modeling tolerance and respect for others, despite their shortcomings, teaches children that people don't have to be perfect.

**Seek qualified professional help as necessary:** While many children outgrow their shyness, others carry it forward with them into adulthood. If your child is struggling — particularly if your child is challenged by a non-verbal learning disability or if you have a history of anxiety disorders, depression or substance abuse in your family, consider getting professional help. The right support will make your child's shyness just one small setback in the course of his/her development.

Art Adventures from Ms. Thornes  
Welcome to a new school year in art. Our art lessons in school have started with discovering lines. We talked about natural and man-made lines that we see or even feel around us and how you can use them to draw shapes, patterns, letters, numbers, and textures. I asked the children to take a walk inside and outside their homes to discover lines that are all around us. I also suggested rubbing — placing a paper on top of a

line and rubbing a crayon to capture the line texture. We discussed various tools to create lines — pencils, crayons, water colors, and markers. Children looked at shells, shoes, and a fall still life to do their drawings.

At home, I suggest encouraging children to start a journal of drawings — using different tools to capture the changing seasons, a favorite toy, a cartoon, a pet, a bird in the yard, or even an imaginary subject. You can also take advantage of the many live and online art activities offered by the National Gallery of Art in Washington, DC. Visit their website at [www.nga.gov/kids](http://www.nga.gov/kids). They have a ton of fun family workshops you can sign up for. Or simply enjoy one of their web art tours, which change by the week.

PE Prompts from Mr. Frailey  
Fall is a great time of year to get outside and get active. Bundle up and try to go out for a hike to get some fall exercise. There are plenty of fun hiking trails around the area that you can enjoy as a family. One of my personal favorites is Sugar Loaf Mountain. The leaves are turning gorgeous colors and once you reach the top, it is extremely beautiful.
