



The U.S. stopped exports of steel, scrap iron, and aviation fuel to Japan, because Japan took over what we now know as Southeast Asia. A few months later, Japan signed a treaty with the Soviet Union to stop any attacks from the Soviet Union if Japan would go to war with England or the U.S. while invading more of Southeast Asia.

Because the Japanese would not leave Indochina, the U.S., England, and the Netherlands froze Japanese money in their banks. Japan couldn't buy oil, which meant its army, navy and air force would be completely useless.


So Japan tried to take the oil resources of Southeast Asia. The U.S. demanded that Japan withdraw from China and Indochina. But Japan didn't pay any attention. While they tried to get the oil back, they also prepared for war.

The Green Hornet

Jenny Jochens celebrates Iceland's successful use of the law to peacefully convert the entire country to Christianity during the Althing in the year 1000. Governing their country as a commonwealth, Icelanders maintained freedom from Norwegian rule for over three centuries, finally returning to Norway's yoke under King Haakon Haakonsson in the year 1262. After forming the commonwealth, Icelanders could settle most disputes, even the controversial shift from paganism to Christianity, through peaceful arbitration, and, unlike Norway and other monarchial societies, Iceland saw "no pagan relapses" because of the people's careful use of the law.




