Bus Patrol Operation

The bus driver is **always fully responsible** for the safety of both the bus and its passengers. Bus patrol members are his/her aides in properly safeguarding children using the bus.

Front Bus Patrol Member Duties

- 1. On the way to school.
 - a. Assist students at the bus steps.
 - b. When students must cross the highway:
 - Remain out of the roadway, take 10 giant steps from the front of the bus.
 - 2) Look for approaching traffic.
 - 3) Wait for a signal from the driver.
 - 4) When it is safe, send students across.
 - 5) Do NOT cross with the students. Wait for them to finish crossing.

2. At school.

- a. Get off the bus first.
- b. Assist at bus steps.

3. Loading for trip home.

- Keep students from crowding.
- b. Assist at steps.
- Help keep order while enroute.

4. Discharge at stops.

- a. Check students and their belongings.
- b. Get off the bus first.
- c. Assist at steps.
- d. Assist when students must cross the highway.



- Remain out of the roadway, take 10 giant steps from the front of the bus.
- 2. Look for approaching traffic.
- 3. Wait for a signal from the driver.
- 4. When it is safe, send the student across.
- Do NOT cross with the students. Continue watching until they have completed crossing.

Rear Bus Patrol Member Duties

- 1. Be sure students are in their assigned seats.
 - a. Check attendance.

2. Help keep order.

- a. No fighting or throwing objects.
- b. Students must be seated while the bus is in motion.
- c. No tampering with the doors or windows.
- d. Books, lunch containers, and other belongings must be kept out of the aisle.
- 3. General assistance to the bus driver.
 - a. Help see that students take their things when leaving the bus.
 - b. Assist in the use of the emergency door if necessary.
 - c. Report to the driver any damage to the bus.
