## **Breakfast and Lunch**

Meal prices will be \$2.55 for lunch. Our breakfast program is free to all students and available in the classroom every morning.

Students in Maryland who qualify for reduced-price meals will not be charged for breakfast or lunch. Families can apply online now so that benefits will be in place when school starts. Families can access the online application by visiting <u>www.myschoolapps.com</u>/. Please remember a new application must be completed for any family requesting assistance this school year.

## Arrival and Dismissal

Arrival begins at 9:00 am. Students may enter the building at that time and go to line up. Kindergarteners and 5th graders go to the gym. Everyone else goes to the lunch room. <u>Do not drop your child off prior to 9:00 a.m. They will be unsupervised</u>. Dismissal begins at 3:50. You may arrive prior to 3:50 to wait for dismissal. Kindergarteners are dismissed through the doors by the gym. Walkers, car riders and bus riders are dismissed from the front doors. <u>Parents must contact the main office</u> <u>before 3:00 p.m. with any dismissal changes for the day.</u>

## Immunizations and Medications

It is very important that your child is up-to-date on his/her immunizations. If you are not sure, please check with your doctor. The state law mandates that children not be admitted to school without the proper immunizations. Medications must be brought to school in the original container by an adult along with MCPS Form 525-13 (Authorization to Administer Prescribed Medication) completed by your physician. Medication will not be administered without proper authorization. Please contact our Health Technician if you have any questions.

## School Cash Online

Montgomery County Public Schools has transitioned to a new online payment system called SchoolCash Online as its preferred method of payment for school-related fees such as fundraisers, field trips, obligations, etc.

SchoolCash Online helps parents/guardians and community members pay school-related fees safely, quickly, and easily. SchoolCash Online will help increase efficiency and security at schools by making payments directly into schools' bank accounts and eliminating the need for teachers to handle money. In addition, once registered, you will be immediately informed about school activities!

Powered by KEV Group, SchoolCash Online is the industry leader in the management of school fees. The new system puts all of the school-related fees online for purchase so users can make purchases online using a credit card or e-check. A processing fee will be included on all items available for purchase, regardless of the type of payment used on SchoolCash Online or at the school.

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#### Interims in Quarter 1

Each quarter that your child is in MCPS, you will receive an interim progress report halfway through the term in Parent VUE. Interim grades are given to inform you how your child is progressing towards mastering standards. Interims will be posted on ParentVUE on 10/5, or mailed home if you are not registered at this time.

For the 1st quarter you can expect to see less grades on your child's interim than other quarters, especially in the subjects of reading and writing. This is because we are establishing reading and writing routines through our curriculum Benchmark Advanced.

Additionally, In Kindergarten, students are still adjusting to the school and classroom and learning routines. Because of this you will see very few grades on your child's Kindergarten interim report in October.

By report card distribution in November you will see grades in all subjects for your child.
