Report Cards Are Coming Home This Week!

For this marking period, you may think that some grades are missing as you will see blank boxes for different measurement topics. Typically, these have been shaded to indicate that the particular topic was not taught and/or assessed for the current marking period. There is no shading for this marking period, but there will be blank boxes. If you have questions about your child's report card, please contact your child's teacher.



School Improvement Planning at Rockwell ES

This year, all schools in our district have a singular school improvement goal:

To mitigate the learning interruptions to ensure all students are on grade level or higher for literacy and math by the end of the year

At Rockwell, we are approaching this in a variety of ways. The first best approach is to be certain that our students are receiving excellent and effective first instruction. This means that our teachers are planning together to determine the best approach

to deliver the curriculum in both literacy and math. We work with teachers through professional learning to sharpen skills and hone their lessons to meet the needs of students. We are examining student assessments to determine individual needs. We analyze state, district and classroom assessments to uncover deficits and strengths for individuals and groups of students. Teachers are organizing small group instruction so that they can differentiate from one group to another within their classes. This way, first instruction is not only effective, but also tailored to student needs to

realize a state where all students will be at or above our grade level benchmarks by the end of the school year. We have identified more intensive academic interventions for students that address some significant learning interruptions that we have uncovered. Interventions are tiered based on their intensity and how often students are engaged in this type of learning. Our special educators, specialists, and paraeducators are all involved in interventions designed to fill in where learning has

been interrupted for individual students. Your child's teacher may have discussed the possibility of a virtual tutoring program designed to take place after school hours. We have not been able to secure adequate staffing for this tutoring. It is on hold until we can hire the staff necessary to provide this one type of intervention. We will keep you updated on this piece of our program as things change. In the meantime, we are seeing students make terrific gains in their academic skills and knowledge. You will hear and see where your child is learning at your scheduled parent-teacher conference later this month.



Music & Movement At Rockwell ES

This year, Mr. Beabout (Physical Education) and Mrs. Looper (Music) are offering a MUSIC AND MOVEMENT class to all 4th and 5th grade students at Rockwell. We have had an amazing response with 100 students signed up! This is replacing our traditional Chorus Class for at least the first half of the school year. The goal is to provide fun and engaging activities that

promote student well-being through movement activities and music while practicing concepts and skills that we have learned in P.E. and Music class. MUSIC AND MOVEMENT class will be from 9:05-9:50 every other Wednesday, alternating 4th and 5th grade weeks. MUSIC AND MOVEMENT will include reading and performing music on Boomwhacker instruments, rhythm cup games, line dances, expressive movement, yoga, cup stacking and music and physical education games. Buses, Parking & Traffic Around Rockwell

We are happy to report that our buses are arriving closer to our dismissal time and students are getting home closer to the typical time that they have in past years. We continue to work with our transportation partners in MCPS to improve pick up times for our last two later

buses. We appreciate our bus drivers every day for their consistency and their safety consciousness in bringing our students to school and back home again. If you have an occasion, please express thanks to your child's bus driver.



Since we returned to school full time, we have had an increase in students being dropped off and picked up by parents. Some parents stay in cars and pick up in the pick-up loop. Others park either in the lot or on the streets around Rockwell and walk up to drop off or pick up students. We want to be able to accommodate all and at the same time keep all of our students safe as they come and leave school daily. Parents are always invited to stay in their cars and pick up- we work to keep this process moving, but safe for all. If you prefer to park your car and walk up, please be conscious of where you are parking and the impact on our neighbors. Cutsail Drive has a sidewalk on both sides and it is wide-enough to accommodate cars parked on both sides of the road (please take notice of the no parking signs close to the intersection of the school drive-way). The side streets

off of Cutsail Drive are not as wide and do not have sidewalks. When these streets become congested with cars on both sides, this makes for a dangerous walking path for students and adults who live on these streets. All of the streets around the building are public and are "open" for parking. However, we can all take care of one another and particularly our students by making adjustments to keep safe walking paths from close neighbors to the school open. Weekly COVID Testing Continues:

CIAN Diagnostics continues to visit Rockwell every Friday afternoon for COVID testing. Parents should be receiving negative results via email. We will continue to test on Friday afternoons. You can give permission for your child to be tested weekly if you have not done so already. Please log into Parent Vue and search for COVID testing. If you experience difficulty, please call the school and seek assistance from Mrs. Nelson or Mr. Isabell.

What if your child is sick? Have you considered becoming an MCPS Substitute?



MCPS is seeking substitute teachers! Substitute teaching is an excellent way to learn about our schools while allowing principals and teachers to get to know you. To qualify as a substitute teacher, each applicant must present proof of the completion of the minimum of an associate's degree or 60 college credits from an accredited institution.

Substitute teachers are temporary employees and are on an on call basis. An automated substitute calling system helps you manage your work schedule by allowing you to call at any time, day or night, to find jobs. This system is telephone and internet accessible. The system uses your subject area and location preferences to offer you jobs on the days you have selected and allows you to change the days you work.

Substitute Teacher Rates: Daily hourly rate of pay \$18.79- Long Term rate \$26.81.

If you hold a valid Maryland professional eligibility certificate or standard advanced professional certificate, the daily hourly rate of pay is \$19.97-Long Term rate \$28.45. In order to qualify for this higher rate of pay, you must submit a copy of your valid Maryland certificate.

Beginning October 2021, all school volunteers and partnering agencies will be required to complete an additional new module via their *myMCPS Classroom/Canvas* account called **COVID-19 Vaccination Attestation** in order to volunteer within our school district. Currently, all volunteers/contractors must complete the vCAN (Volunteer Child Abuse/Neglect) module. In addition, depending on level of volunteering, some are required to be fingerprinted, per the vCAN FAQ. Fingerprinting requirements are not being changed. The new module will consist of a volunteer a) attesting to being fully vaccinated, b) uploading their *Certificate of COVID-19 Vaccination* from the Maryland Department of Health, and c) agreeing to specific expectations of masking and social distancing while in MCPS facilities.

User-Guides on how to access both module requirements and how to access and upload their *Certificate of COVID-19 Vaccination* from the Maryland Department of Health will be available on the Child Abuse and Neglect and the <u>Volunteers websites</u>.
