Dear Rockwell School Community,

We know many of our families will spend time over the Thanksgiving break traveling, visiting with friends and family, and engaging in fun community activities. As these activities possibly involve a higher risk of exposure to COVID-19, MCPS is distributing at-home rapid test kits to students and staff prior to the break.



Testing is an important way to identify individuals actively positive for

COVID-19 who should temporarily isolate in order to prevent further transmission and keep our school community as healthy as possible. Testing is not mandatory. We are depending on our staff and families to consider their exposure risk, and test and report positive results accordingly.

Please note that schools will receive <u>a new type of test kit</u>, made by InteliSwab. Video instructions for InteliSwab can be found here in <u>English</u> and <u>Spanish</u> and here for <u>other test kit types</u>. Please note that the InteliSwab test takes 30 minutes for results. Test kits should be used for staff and students. For other family members, free rapid test kits are also available at most <u>public library locations</u>.

What do I do if the rapid test is positive?

Please report positive tests for staff or students on the <u>MCPS COVID-19 Reporting Form</u>. Individuals who have a positive COVID-19 test will need to follow <u>CDC guidelines for isolation</u>.

What do I do if the rapid test is negative?

Negative test results do not need to be reported.

Please remember that non-COVID respiratory infections like influenza and RSV are also circulating in our community. Healthy habits include isolating when sick, good handwashing and covering coughs and sneezes help prevent illness. <u>COVID-19</u> and <u>influenza</u> vaccination are available for free for Montgomery County residents.

Have you considered becoming an MCPS Substitute?

MCPS is seeking substitute teachers! Substitute teaching is an excellent way to learn about our schools while allowing principals and teachers to get to know you. To qualify as a substitute teacher, each applicant must present proof of the completion of the minimum of an associate's degree or 60 college credits from an accredited institution.

Substitute teachers are temporary employees and are on an on call basis. An automated substitute calling system helps you manage your work schedule by allowing you to call at any time, day or night, to find jobs. This system is telephone and internet accessible. The system uses your subject area and location preferences to offer you jobs on the days you have selected and allows you to change the days you work.

Substitute Teacher Rates: Daily hourly rate of pay \$18.79- Long Term rate \$26.81.

If you hold a valid Maryland professional eligibility certificate or standard advanced professional certificate, the daily hourly rate of pay is \$19.97-Long Term rate \$28.45. In order to qualify for this higher rate of pay, you must submit a copy of your valid Maryland certificate.
