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

#### Indoor or Outdoor



The temperatures lately suggest that winter has arrived. Even though technically, winter begins on December 21st, we have all had to pull out the winter coats as well as other cold weather gear. We encourage you to be certain that your child is dressed appropriately for temperatures. Hats, gloves and heavier coats are helpful when it is cold outside. Here are the guidelines that we use to determine whether students will go outside or stay indoors for recess:

- ❖ We factor in the wind chill to determine the "feels like" temperature in making all decisions about indoor vs. outdoor recess
- ❖ If it "feels like" less than 30 degrees Fahrenheit, we choose to keep students indoors for recess
- We must be consistent with students for indoor vs. outdoor recess due to adult supervision requirements- all students who have recess together either go out or stay in
- ❖ Indoor recess is held in the classroom and teachers have collected games and activities for students to do with friends in their classroom during the 40 minute recess time

Our teachers continue to take advantage of milder days to take students outside for a walk, to have a quick discussion outdoors, or even to do a short lesson. We will continue to do this as the weather conditions allow. This is a terrific break for students and Rockwell staff members to get fresh air.
