## **FUNDRAISING FORUM**

Thanks to all of your donations, three ELMO projectors have been ordered. We need seven more to reach our goal of one in every classroom. In order to do this, we need to raise an additional \$10,500. ## ADVOCACY CORNER: New Elementary School and JWMS Addition Recommended

On Oct. 28, Superintendent Starr released his recommendations for school construction in the Richard Montgomery Cluster. For the complete RM Cluster section of the Superintendent's Recommended 2013 Capital Budget and the FY2013-2018 Capital Improvements Program, go to www.montgomeryschoolsmd.org/departments/planning/PDF/CIP13\_Ch4\_MontgomeryR.pdf/. In summary, Dr. Starr recommends the construction of a fifth elementary school, RM Cluster ES#5 on Edmonston St., off of Wootton Pkwy., with a request for funding to allow a scheduled opening of August 2015. His recommendation is for the school-only option with a program capacity of 740 students. No other ES additions have been recommended at this time because MCPS believes the new school with this program capacity will address revised projected enrollment. There will be a boundary study conducted in connection with opening the new elementary and there will be some RPES families going to the new school for the 2015-2016 school year. Dr. Starr also recommended the construction of the JWMS addition, which will bring program capacity from 986 to 1444 students, with a funding request to allow for an August 2016 opening. Any RPES family with a child in Grades 2-5 may be impacted by construction at JWMS.

The PTA is pleased with Dr. Starr's recommendations. We understand that families may have questions regarding how these planned construction projects will affect the learning environment for their children. If you do, plan to attend the **Richard Montgomery Cluster PTA Facilities Meeting on Monday, Nov. 7, 7:30-9pm** in the RMHS cafeteria to discuss these CIP recommendations with MCPS staff and other officials.

Also, on Monday, Nov. 14, beginning at 7pm, the Board of Education will be hearing public testimony about the CIP. Testimony that night will include one of the RM Cluster Coordinators, Cheryl Moss Herman, advocating for the construction needs of our cluster. The BOE must approve the Superintendent's recommendations and send them to the County Council for funding in order for the projects to stay on schedule. We need parents to attend to show the importance of these projects to our families. Plan to attend wearing your Ritchie Park shirts!
