Curriculum News

In Math, we have just finished Module 4 on addition and subtraction strategies, with a focus on adding and subtracting within 10. Next, we will begin Module 5, which centers on the teen numbers as a foundation for place value. Students will use their knowledge of "counting the Say 10 Way" to group objects as 10 ones and some more ones. We will also spend time working with the hundreds chart, counting both by ones and by tens to 100. You can practice counting to 100 at home and have your child look at number relationships on the hundreds chart.

In Reading, we will begin Unit 7, "Why do we celebrate people and events?" Readers will have an opportunity to read and compare several selections about different holidays and celebrations around the world. We will continue our fiction focus of listening and retelling key details from the story and describing cause and effect relationships. We will also engage in informational texts, using text features and comparing and contrasting texts. Please continue encouraging your child to read with expression at home and to pick out the important, or key, parts of each book.

In Social Studies, we will analyze elements of life from the past. We will compare toys, transportation, games, clothes, sports, etc. of the past with that of the present and explore how they have changed overtime.

Our Leader in Me Lessons will focus on Habit # 6: Synergize. We will learn how to work with others, celebrate connections with others, and how to lead others.
