Curriculum Highlights

Math: We will continue our exploration of multiplication and division in Module 3.

Topic A: Students will study and apply the commutative and distributive properties. Students will begin to use a letter to represent the unknown when multiplying and dividing.

Topic B: Students will count by 6 and 7 to multiply and divide using number bonds to decompose. Students will also interpret the unknown to model and solve word problems using units of 6 and 7.

Topic C: Students will use the associative and distributive properties as a strategy to multiply and divide. Students will understand the function of parentheses and use it to solve problems.

<u>SEL:</u> Marking Period 2 will focus on Habit 2: **Begin with the End in Mind.** We will be talking about about the importance of thinking ahead, having clear expectations when working in teams, the importance of considering consequences, and students will be developing a personal mission statement. Below are some questions you can ask your child as we explore Habit 2:

- "How does a mental picture help you think ahead?"
- "Why do clear expectations help a team be more effective?"
- "What are the positive consequences of working toward your academic goal?"
- "What is your personal mission statement?"

Science: In December, we will begin our unit of study on weather and climate. Students will explore how scientists record patterns of the weather across different times and areas so that they can make predictions about what kind of weather might happen next. Students will also explore the water cycle, different types of precipitation, and extreme weather events.

Social Studies: We will begin Science in December.
