Housing and Clothing of the Aztecs

King/Emperor Housing

 Some rooms on the first floor were council offices , law courts and store rooms for tributes

Rich/Noble Housing

• Rich people had adobe bricks made from mud

Poor/Peasant Housing

 Usally they had wowven reeds together and if there were they would put mud

King/Emperor Clothing

- He wore head dresses and nose ear jewelry
- A special color that could only be worn by the emperor was tourquoise green



Rich/Noble Clothing

- Cloaks that were made from cotton and were colored
- Could only wear sandals
- A type of really rich people called pipiltin
- wear cotton in the city
- Aztecs like brightly colored clothing

Poor/Peasant Clothing

• Any poor who wore a robe to their ankles Would be killed.

Aztec Religion
