From the Principal

It is hard to believe that we are already well past the midway point of the academic year. Soon, these cold mornings that we are experiencing will give way to spring and all our efforts in staying warm will be a thing of the past. Summer is approaching and many students have inquired about their Student Service Learning (SSL) hours. SSL is a requirement for graduation from high school in the state of Maryland. Our students will need 75 hours as a condition of graduation from high school in the state of Maryland. SSL forms are available online at www.mcpsssl.org and in the school counseling office here at JFK. All SSL activities must be nonreligious in nature, occur in a public place and under the supervision of a nonprofit organization representative. One SSL hour is awarded for each hour of service outside of the regular school day. A maximum of 8 hours can be earned in a 24-hour period. ESOL

In the ESOL department, we just finished WIDA/ ACCESS testing. A reminder for students that homework is VERY IMPORTANT because if you are learning a new language, you need LOTS OF PRAC-TICE outside of classes. All ESOL students have workbooks that go with the textbook and they are asked to take their workbooks home and PRAC-TICE in them. Please encourage your child to watch news channels on TV in English because they need practice listening to academic English after school. Finally, please ask your child to read 20 minutes a day at home. This helps build their vocabulary and improve reading skills.



Special Services

Students in Ms. Cory's 6th period class are working with JFK's MCPS Transition Specialist and the College and Careers office to hold mock interviews, writing resumes and visiting a variety of local businesses to talk with management about job responsibilities and the application process. They found most applications are now online and at Target applications are done at a computer kiosk in the store. Next will be a demonstration of a "cold call" requesting an interview.
