
WHO IS ELIGIBLE TO PARTICIPATE?

- Seniors need a 2.50 unweighted cumulative GPA and juniors/sophomores/freshman need a 2.75
 - Students need qualifying test scores to show college readiness*
 - Test Scores that meet minimum eligibility sections from different tests can be used
 - SAT: 480 on Evidence Based Reading & Writing or 26 Reading sub-score; 530 on Math
 - ACT: 21 on Reading; 21 on Math
 - ACCUPLACER: qualifying assessment levels as listed under course description
 - AP exam scores may be used to meet some course prerequisites
 - Students without the above test scores may:
 - Take MC's remote English and ALEKS (math) assessments to determine their placement levels
 - Use grades from specific high school courses through MC's Alternate Placement Program (APP)
 - Register in MC courses that have no prerequisites or assessment levels
 - *Seniors & Juniors with a 3.0 or higher unweighted GPA are placed at ENGL101/011 and MATH050/117/120 which allows them to take many entry-level courses without submitting test scores

WHAT CLASSES CAN I TAKE?

Classes taken during the school year are chosen from this *list of approved courses* <u>https://tinyurl.com/mcps-mc-courses</u> that can be used for dual (both high school and college) credit* and can transfer to the University System of Maryland. **

Summer classes only need to be on the list of approved courses if dual credit is sought.

Students can find classes by searching: "Montgomery College Dynamic Schedule"

- · Students must meet pre-requisites and assessment levels shown in the course descriptions
- Students may drop two high school classes for each 3-credit course as determined with their counselors
- MC classes offered at WJ are not listed on MC's Dynamic Schedule but are found on the dual enroll registration site
- Students taking an MC class at WJ must be able to abbreviate their schedules for Periods 6 & 7

*If dual credit is accepted the MC class will appear on the student's HS transcript and the grade will be calculated into the GPA as 1 weighted credit (like an AP class)

**Students intending to transfer credits to other schools should contact those admission offices to determine if MC credit is accepted AND if the course may be used for high school credit

WHERE WILL CLASSES BE HELD?

Students can take classes online, on campus, and at WJ!

Eligible seniors and juniors may register for these Fall 2024 MC classes taught at WJ by college faculty:

- ~ Foundations of Human Communication/COMM 108, 2x/week, in-person, 1:00-2:30 p.m.
- ~ International Relations/POLI 203, 2x/week, in-person, 1:00-2:30 p.m.

On days when class is not held, students are expected to leave the building but may return at dismissal for after-school activities or to ride a school bus; Davis Public Library is a convenient location for students during this non-instructional time.

Students can register in other MC courses, that may be offered in one of these formats:

- Remote Learning (synchronous) with scheduled online class times using Zoom or a similar platform
- Distance Learning (asynchronous) without direct instruction or scheduled meeting times; students work independently
- <u>In-person</u> instruction at WJ or one of MC's three campuses: Rockville, Germantown, or Takoma Park/Silver Spring; MCPS transportation is offered at limited times during the day to/from WJHS and the MC Rockville campus
- · Hybrid/Blended combines in-person instruction and online learning

** <u>WHAT IS THE COST?</u> Classes taken during the school year are offered at "no cost," including tuition, fees, textbooks, and required materials. Students taking *summer* classes are responsible for all costs but may apply for financial assistance via the MC High School Summer Grant; applications are due ten days before the start of class.
