The above data represents the demographic information of the **226** family members from **John T. Baker Middle School** who participated in the Antiracist Stakeholder Survey and provided feedback. A total of **47** respondents did not identify their race when filling the survey.

Family members were able to select one or more races that described their race/ethnicity. **Single Race** indicates family members who chose only one race/ethnicity (i.e., a responded who chose Asian **or** African American), **Multiracial** indicates family members who chose more than one race/ethnicity (i.e., a respondent who chose Asian **and** African American). **All Respondents** indicates the total count of everyone who chose a certain racial category, regardless of whether they were **Single Race** or **Multiracial**. These three manners of disaggregating the data highlight the diversity of the population of MCPS at each school.
