Click on the “families” link on the [www.lexile.com](http://www.lexile.com) website. This link will connect you to several resources.

On the ‘Welcome’ page, you’ll find several useful links including...

The [lexile book database](#) allows you to search for titles of books that fall within your student’s lexile range.

The [lexile calculator](#) will help you to determine the level of comprehension a student will have with a given book. It is a way to check the match between the reader and the book.

The [quick book search](#) will give you the lexile of a particular title.

On the ‘Tools’ page, you’ll find resources such as...

[Lexile Power Vocabulary](#) provides vocabulary words and activities by book title to help enrich student’s reading and vocabulary skills.

[Lexile Reading Pathfinders](#) help parents and students to find out the lexile levels of books in popular series.
