MS. RICE'S COUNSELING UPDATE

When you think about anxiety, what do you think of?

For most, we think of panic and fear, fight or flight. General anxiety can take a low-level threat and make it feel huge, initiating fight or flight for something like an Algebra test, or a night away from home, as if you were in serious danger, like a grizzly bear running at you. This panic or fear can make us feel wound up, restless, on-edge and as a result, extremely tired.

But, what about the anxiety that is less visible - the super organized, everything must be done perfect, conscientious, straight A student who is also exhausted at the end of the day? This might look like your typical Type A personality, and this might be high functioning anxiety.

As parents, we all want our children to be successful and we all define success a little differently. Some demand straight A's, others hope for application to magnet programs, some offer incentives for assignment completion and Honor Roll, while others praise effective effort, and some consider happiness success. Our children also have differing views of success and there are some who put a lot of pressure on themselves to be perfect.

Perfectionism has its perks, but it also has its downside. Constantly overthinking things, the need to please others and have trouble saying no, a tendency to dwell on mistakes, nervous habits like nail biting, hair twirling and leg shaking. These symptoms all have the ability to rev our bodies up, to cause difficulty concentrating, create irritability, and leave us restless, but exhausted.

High functioning anxiety is often overlooked from a parent perspective, because, after all, who wouldn't want a conscientious, organized child. It can be seen as adaptive and resilient. It is also often overlooked from a student perspective because it's difficult to see their ways as problematic, especially when this defines so much of who they are. Maybe you yourself are a Type A personality and your child is mirroring what they see modeled for them.

This is why it's especially important to talk with your child. If you have a high-achiever who takes on every challenge; if you have a conscientious student who struggles to sleep; if you have a child who works hard but never seems satisfied if you just have that sixth sense – check in with your child. There is an optimum level of anxiety that fuels us to be at our best. There is also anxiety that leads to a crash and burn.
