Note: Recounts the traditional story of the tortoise and the hare and an

original episode in which the tortoise attempts to obtain the hare's liver

for the Fish Queen.

Note: A Spanish American retelling of the familiar story of a kind girl who is mistreated by her jealous stepmother and stepsisters. In this version, the Virgin Mary replaces the traditional fairy godmother.

Note: Examines the life of Cesar Chavez, the Mexican American labor leader who achieved justice for migrant farm workers by creating a union to protect their rights.
