

BCC Boys Soccer game report, Oct. 12, 2010

There was some good news about Tuesday's BCC boys soccer game at Springbrook – the Barons get to play again on Wednesday.

The BCC boys seemed a bit off their game from the start, and surrendered a goal less than 15 minutes into the game on a free kick that bounced around in the box for too long before a Springbrook player took advantage. Coach Melendez tried various combinations, but passes were not connecting with their usual precision and fluidity.

The Barons did give it a game effort in the second half as they tried to put more pressure on the Springbrook defense and work from possession. At one point, a free kick evaded the grasp of the Springbrook goalie as he stood on his line and had to scramble backwards to grab it, but the referee ruled the ball did not cross over the goal line.

With a few minutes left, an alert Springbrook player took advantage as the Barons pushed forward in the effort to score the tying goal and buried the ball after breaking loose on a breakaway.

The BCC boys soccer Barons will hit the road again Wednesday night at Magruder, looking to put the loss behind them and build on their 4-2-2 record.
