In the Bethesda version of “El Clasico,” B-CC turned in a dominating performance to spoil Whitman’s Senior Night with a 3-0 win at Whitman. While not as strong as last year’s state championship team, Whitman still has a lot of talent and was the more assertive team in the opening minutes. The Barons proved opportunistic, however, when in the 6th minute Stephen Sawicki launched a long throw from deep on the left side all the way to the far post where Freddie Nzekele was able to nod it in and give the Barons a 1-0 advantage.

As the half progressed, the Barons found their rhythm and began to take control of the game. Solid midfield play from Bradley Vorv, Ben Alexander, Noah Riskind, Jimmy Doll, Robert Palmer, and the ever present Collin Martin, dictated the flow.

The Barons struck again in the 38th minute following a change of possession on an out of bounds ball. Ben Gold made a quick throw-in towards the left corner that Vorv was swift to control. Vorv then sent a cross to the far post, just over Luc Sebrechts who was charging forward for a header. Though Sebrechts couldn’t reach it, the ball fell right to the feet of Palmer who gladly tapped in the goal to give the Barons a 2-0 lead going into halftime.

The second half played out much like the first. The Barons controlled possession and probed for chances, with Nzekele being a constant menace up top. After several near misses, a skillful build-up of play ended with a Martin pass to Vorv inside the box to set up the Barons third goal. Vorv pulled the ball out of the air, settled it on his right foot and drilled it into the side netting for the Barons final tally of the night.

Whitman failed to muster many chances due largely to the solid play from the Barons well-organized back line of Sawicki, Gold, Cy McNeill, Tim McKay, and Jake Elsey. Coby Friedman’s sure hands took care of any balls that did make their way towards B-CC’s goal.

B-CC (6-2-3) wraps up its regular season on Senior Night at home Tuesday versus Damascus.
