The Barons opened their post-season play with a convincing win at home. The game was less than a minute old when Cy McNeill worked the ball deep down the right side and sent a cross towards the goal. The keeper could only block the ball away, which ended up at Ben Alexander's feet just outside the top of the box. Alexander settled the ball, slid right past a Panther defender, then fired a rocket to the top corner of the far post that the keeper had no chance to stop, giving the Barons a quick 1-0 advantage. A short time later, McNeill again probed the right side, this time connecting with Collin Martin inside the box. Martin calmly collected the ball, measured the keeper, then lifted it over the keeper's outstretched arms into the far side netting to put the Barons up 2-0.

Martin was a constant threat. In the 27<sup>th</sup> minute, he worked his way through the left side of the defense, then the center, and with several frustrated defenders in his wake fired home the Barons third goal of the night.

From there, B-CC became more content to control possession and were selective in attacking. In the 59<sup>th</sup> minute, Noah Riskind's run down the middle was rewarded with a cross from Martin. Riskind one-timed the ball under the keeper to put the Barons up 4-0. The Barons' final tally came in the 77<sup>th</sup> minute with Freddy Nzekele connecting with a well-positioned, unmarked, Jimmy Salsbury who drilled a strong finish right through the Panthers' keeper.

Similar to the meeting two weeks ago, the Panthers were simply overmatched by a complete B-CC team effort. The scariest moment for keeper Coby Friedman was when an errant back pass nearly found the far corner of the goal before he was able to control it.
