INDIVIDUAL SCHOLARSHIPS

“Dare to Dream...Expect to Succeed” National College Scholarship Program

AWARD: College scholarships, educational software, computers

CRITERIA: Students are asked to tell about their dream...and how they hope to achieve it. Any medium can be used – prose, poetry, photography, collage, sculpture or painting – depending upon the interest of the individual child. Parents are asked to discuss how they will help make this dream come true. What have they, as parents, chosen to do or dreamed of that will enable their children to understand the power of choice, and the power of working together to make it happen.

DEADLINE: Each quarter, one top prizewinner from across the nation receives a college scholarship.

Kids’ Chance of Maryland, Inc.

CRITERIA: All LGBT students nationwide are eligible. Point Scholars agree to maintain a high level of academic performance and give back to the LGBT community through the completion of an individual community service project. Each Point Scholar makes a personal investment in their own future by either working while studying or acquiring debt to help finance their education.

CRITERIA: The applicant must be a U.S. citizen or eligible non-citizen, have an annual adjusted gross family income of \$35,000 or less, and plans to attend a two-year or four-year college or technical/vocational school. Approximately 50% of the awards will be targeted to applicants from the eight states that USA Funds serves as the federally designated guarantor of student loans, of which Maryland is one. Additionally, up to 50% of the awards go to applicants who are also members of an ethnic-minority group or have a documented physical disability. Scholarship awards will be based on the applicant's leadership and participation in school and community activities, work experience, career and educational aspirations and goals, and unusual personal or family circumstances.
