

English 11 On-Level Summer Reading Assignment 2011

1. Read a nonfiction book.

You can choose your book. Here are some of the titles available through the school. You may also choose your own nonfiction title.

The Autobiography of Malcolm X Alex Haley
The Color of Water James McBride
A Hope in the Unseen Ron Suskind
Hunger for Memory Richard Rodriguez

I. Write a **typed 150-word minimum** rationale for choosing your book. Include why you chose to read the book. (*see below for an example*)

Example of Rationale

I chose to read *The Color of Water* for the summer reading assignment after looking at the reviews on Amazon.com. Many of the reviewers described the book as “powerful” and “moving,” so I thought that it would be a story that would hold my attention. The title itself was intriguing to me, and I wanted to learn more about its relationship to the story. After reading a synopsis of the book online, I thought that the narrative would appeal to me: I too have faced many struggles growing up and I can sympathize with the obstacles James McBride had to overcome to become a successful writer. He is the same age as my parents, so I was also interested to see if his experiences growing up in that time period were similar to what my parents went through. I discussed the book with my parents, and even though they did not read it, they were able to confirm some of the details about life in the city during the 1960s, especially in terms of race relations.

- C. Describe the main conflict/argument in your book. Use specific examples from the book to illustrate your points.
- D. Why is setting so important in your book? Use specific examples from the book to illustrate your points.
- E. How is your book relevant to present-day culture? Use specific examples from the book to illustrate your points.
- F. Would you describe the main character as a hero? Explain your answer and use specific examples from the book to illustrate your point.
