Math and Reading Activities and Games

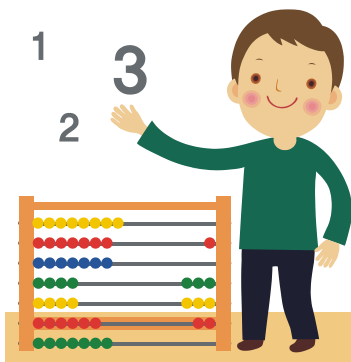
Students and parents will learn and play different math and reading games and activities. Students will be able to take home activities. Grade level rooms are below.

- Kindergarten and First Grade: Reading in room K3; Math in the Art room
- Second and Third Grade: Reading in room 17; Math in room 16
- Fourth Grade: Reading in the Media Center; Math in room 9
- Fifth Grade: Reading in room 5 (Husky Den); Math in room 10



Other Activities for All Grades

- Computer lab – Students can visit the computer lab to explore and play different math and reading games.
- Music room – Students can visit Mr. Amberg in the music room to participate in music activities that support math and reading.
- Read-aloud – Students will hear staff read different children's books. Read-alouds will take place in rooms 6 and 7. A schedule with times and guest readers will be given out when students and parents arrive.



Students will receive a passport when they arrive, and they will get a stamp at each location they attend. Students will turn in their passports in the box by the front office as they leave in order to be entered in a raffle for different children's books and school supplies. Raffle winners will be declared the following morning on the announcements.
