The gifts do not wrap themselves. Thanks to the following volunteers who found time during a very busy week to spend time at the booth:

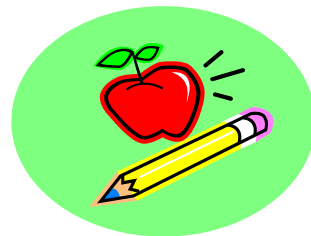

News and Notes from the Einstein Counseling Department:

Schedule Change and Course Selection

Course selections were sent home in the beginning of June. **If you want to make changes to the courses you are registered for, this MUST be done by June 16th.** Changing your mind about a course is not an acceptable reason for a schedule change after June 16th.

Summer School Registration

The last day to register for Session 1 of Summer School is June 10th. For Session 2, it's July 9th.

Summer school runs June 28 – July 16 for Session 1 and July 19 – August 6 for Session 2. All classes meet daily from 8:10AM – 1:00PM. You can download the registration form from www.montgomeryschoolsmd.org/departments/extendedhours/summerschool. Your Counselor needs to sign the form for it to be considered complete.

Attention Juniors

Very important!! Family Connection is a web-based resource that supports college and career planning. Family Connection is specific to our school and al-

lows students, counselors and families to: share college and career plans, compare colleges, track application deadlines, produce scattergrams and access the schedule of college visits. Students can also use Family Connections to see college acceptances for previous Einstein classes. Students can compare their GPA and test scores to the historical data of students from Einstein who have applied and been admitted to a particular school.

Family Connection codes have been given to all present sophomores and juniors. We have asked for parent emails so you can receive information that we send via Family Connection. If your child has not already done so, please log on to Family Connection and complete this process. Click on the “About Me” tab and in the “official things” box click on “profile”; you can add a parent at this point and update any incorrect information. We will use Family Connection to disseminate lots of information about college visits, scholarships and general reminders. Don't miss out! The website is www.connection.naviance.com. If your child does not know how to log on to the site, please call your counselor or Ms. DeOto for log in information.

The summer is the best time to get serious about

the college process. Juniors should visit colleges and schedule an appointment to meet with their counselor or Ms. DeOto to talk over your ideas and plans. June and July are good times to look on-line for college applications and essay questions. This gives students an opportunity to get a head start on the process before the crush of Senior Year begins. The Counseling Department processes a large volume of application materials, **so please allow a full 20 school days for us to process forms, transcripts, recommendations, etc. Know your deadlines!!! Allow plenty of time for “glitches” and get your materials in early!!** On-line college applications are acceptable and often preferred, but be sure to make a copy for your records as a backup. This process can be stressful, but careful planning and cooperation can help make it easier. The College Application Packet “Life After High School” is available on the Einstein website under the Counseling Department. You can begin to fill out the questions that your counselor will need you to answer in order to write your college recommendation.



New Promotion Policy

In order to be considered the next grade level, this new policy has been put in effect by MCPS:

- Grade 9 to Grade 10 requires 5 credits, including 1 math and 1 English
- Grade 10 to Grade 11 requires 10 credits, including 2 math, 2 English, 1 science and 1 social studies
- Grade 11 to Grade 12 requires 15 credits, including 3 math, 3 English, 2 science, 2 social studies and the completion of 4 HAS courses

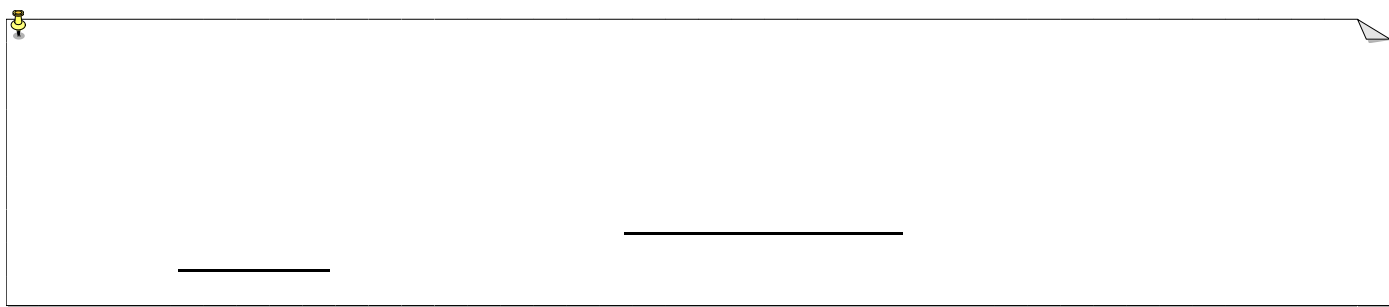
Students still need 22 credits in order to graduate as well as a program completer, technology, physical education, health and art.

Attention High Achieving Sophomores: Important Note on Maryland Distinguished Scholarship Program

The Maryland Distinguished Scholarship Program requires PSAT and SAT scores from a test taken prior to January of the junior year. Current sophomores should be aware of this requirement and plan to take test by January 2011. For information, contact Ms. DeOto in the College and Career Center.

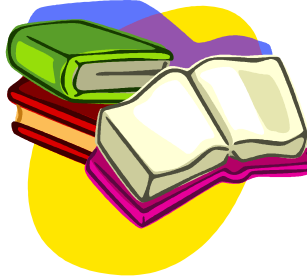

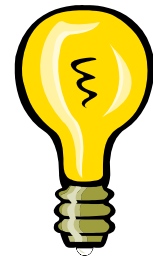
