The 2011-2012 testing schedule has been finalized and is as follows:

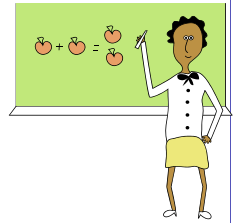

SPECIAL EDUCATION SERVICES – Often, one parent will hear from another that if a child is struggling, the parent should have the child evaluated for special education services or ask the school about a 504 plan to ensure assistance. Special Education services and 504 plans are for children who have diagnosed disabilities and cannot access the curriculum without this high level of support. They are not for children who do not have a disability. Most children will find one subject tougher than another, or will be learning a concept he/she finds unusually difficult. Everyone has different strengths and needs. That is natural and normal. School is not easy! When children have difficulties with their assignments and/or with concepts there are many things that the school can do to help them prior to any discussion about the presence of a disability. To prevent children from unnecessarily being identified as having a disability for an issue that could be addressed by the teacher and school support staff, we employ many strategies to bolster students’ areas of need. Our staff is amazing at giving children the extras they may need to really soar!



Lunch Loan Program - When students run out of money in their accounts, Mrs. Kash, our Cafeteria Manager, will still provide students hot lunches and charge their accounts. However, MCPS will only allow a negative balance of \$10.00. After this threshold is passed, students will only be given a cheese sandwich (no extra food items or milk). Please monitor the balance in your child’s SNAP account. Mrs. Kash sends home a letter when a SNAP account balance gets low or goes into the negative. MyLunchMoney.com is a service being offered which allows parents to make prepayments to their child’s cafeteria account with a credit/debit card using the Internet. Once the account is established, you can check balances, view student purchases, set up recurring payments, and receive low balance e-mail notifications. Prepayments will generally be available at the school the next day. Go to www.myLunchMoney.com for more information.



Homework Help Available on MCPS Web: MCPS has a variety of available homework resources to help students. Many of these resources are subscription-based and accessible with a user name and password. Students can get this information from the media specialist. The public libraries also have a wealth of useful resources, such as homework help websites for students in kindergarten through Grade 5 and for students in Grades 6–12.
