Definitions of Consequences

Detention: Students may be assigned to stay before or after school or during lunch by a teacher or an administrator. Students will be supervised by staff and will be expected to use this time for study or for service to the school. Students/parents will have to make their own transportation arrangements.

Exclusion: Exclusion is the act of not being permitted to attend a given class or classes and/or a specific school activity for an identified period of time. It may be assigned by an administrator.

Expulsion: Expulsion is the act or not being permitted to attend any public school in Montgomery County.

Suspension: Suspension is the act of excluding a student from school activities and classes and from school grounds for a specified period of time. When a student is suspended he/she has the right, at his/her request, to make up missed work immediately upon return to school. It may be assigned by the principal for one to ten school days. A parent conference would be required upon the student's return to school.

Out of school suspensions may only be given when it is determined by the principal that a behavior is disruptive and detrimental to the operation of the school.

Written contracts: Written contracts may be determined by appropriate staff under special circumstances when the aim is to improve behavior and/or academic achievement.

STUDENT APPEAL POLICY

If you believe you have been wrongly accused of a violation, or if you believe you have received an unfair consequence, you may seek assistance from a counselor, teacher, parent or administrator. Student appeal rights are clearly stated in *the Student Rights and Responsibilities* document.
