The National Bar Association is seeking applicants for the **Crump Law Camp** which was established for students entering the 9<sup>th</sup> through 11<sup>th</sup> grades and between the ages of 14 and 17 to introduce them to the judicial system.

The goal of the NBA camp is to encourage young people at an early age to become lawyers and seek legal careers in the future. By 2050 more than half of the people in this country will be of color. More than 90% of the nation's lawyers are white, as are more than 80% of the students enrolled in law school. Yet more than 30% of the United States is comprised of people of color. The NBA is seeking applicants to attend this camp from every ethnic group and its selection process is non-discriminatory.

The first inaugural two week camp was held during the summer at Howard University School of Law through a grant by the Ford Motor Company Fund in 2001. Campers were and will be housed on the Howard University campus and live in a protected camp environment.

**Open enrollment is available to students across the country but emphasis will be on enabling students from low income families to attend.**

Tuition for the camp will vary depending upon family income. The tuition covers transportation to and from Washington, D.C.; housing; meals; educational materials; and expenses for field trips. The camp provides students with an exciting academic and social agenda in the Washington, D. C. area.

The competitive highlight of the camp is the *Evet L. Simmons Mock Trial Competition*. The four winners of this competition are invited to the NBA's Annual Convention.

**HOBY World Leadership Congress Ambassador.** Many of you have anxiously awaited the release of the World Leadership Congress (WLC) application for the 2010 seminar season. We are happy to report that the application is now available online at [www.hoby.org](http://www.hoby.org). This year's WLC will be held July 23-30, at University of California Los Angeles (UCLA). The cost of the program is \$1,500, which includes program fees, room and board, meals, and transportation during the program. Not included in the fee is travel to and from Los Angeles and the cost of transportation from the point of entry to the campus and back on departure day.

The WLC is first-paid, first-served. HOBY advises those of you interested in the WLC to complete your application early and pay the registration fee to reserve. Final confirmation will be provided when HOBY has confirmed that you attended your state leadership seminar. Some parents and students prefer to wait until their seminar has concluded before applying. As the WLC program is extremely popular, HOBY must caution that spaces may be gone if you elect to wait. If you are interested in fundraising for your \$1,500 fee, we recommend you pay the entire fee with a credit card first, to ensure you reserve a space while they are still available.

**University of North Carolina Chapel Hill Project Uplift.** **Project Uplift** is a special program that enables high-achieving rising seniors to experience college life on the Carolina campus. Students spend two days visiting classes, meeting with faculty and staff, interacting with Carolina students, and participating in cultural and social activities. This year's program will be held on May 20-22, May 27-29, June 3-5 and June 10-12. There is a nonrefundable \$10 application fee; beyond that Project Uplift is an all-expense paid program, including meals, room, and program materials (excludes transportation to campus). Project Uplift is designed for students from under-served communities such as American Indians, African Americans, Hispanics/Latinos, and Asian Americans. Prospective first-generation college students and individuals from disadvantaged backgrounds are also welcome.
