*We ask that incoming freshmen select one novel to read over the summer. When the students return to school in the fall, they are expected to bring their completed assignments.*

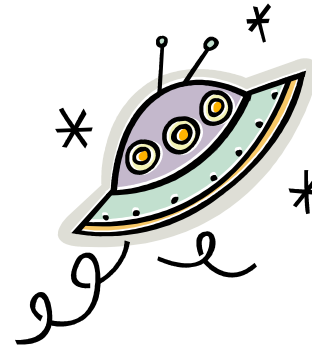

# GRADE 9

*Dear Student,*

*Because reading is integral to good thinking and writing, each student entering Quince Orchard High School in August 2011 is required to complete a reading assignment in preparation for the fall semester.*

## **Requirements**

- Read a science fiction, fantasy, or historical fiction novel.
- Complete the reader-response questions.
- Type or write neatly in ink.
- Answer each question on a separate page.
- For the novel, record the following at the top of your first response:
  - Title, author, copyright date, number of pages.

## **Choosing a Book**

- Please do not select a previously-read novel or required school title.
- Select a novel that is on or somewhat above your reading level.
- Check out a novel from the QOHS Media Center that will be due when school starts next year or one from the public library.

Students may, as another option, read their own books.

## **Due Date**

Bring the completed assignment to class on  
the first day of school.

## **Assignment**

Answer each of the following reader-response questions.

- 1) Choose one passage (4-7 sentences) that describes the protagonist (the main character in the novel). Try to select a passage that describes the emotions and personality of the character, not just his/her physical appearance. Copy the passage. Then, in a paragraph of 5-8 sentences, explain what you learn about the character from the passage.
- 2) Choose one passage that includes imagery describing the setting of the novel ("imagery" is descriptive language that appeals to the senses: seeing, hearing, tasting, smelling, and touching). Copy the passage. Then, in a paragraph of 5-8 sentences, explain how the imagery in this passage helps create the setting (the time and place of the story's action) and mood (what you feel as you read the passage).
- 3) A "theme" is the author's central message or insight into life. In the genres of science fiction, fantasy, and historical fiction, themes often reflect the current society and culture. In a paragraph of 5-8 sentences, explain how a theme in your novel comments on the society and culture at the time the novel was written.

## **Late Enrollment**

Students who enroll after the start of the first semester will have three weeks to complete the summer reading assignment.
