With the start of January 2012, let me update you on the following:

- The Richard Montgomery High School It's Academic team sent three teams of students to the Regional History Bowl and Bee held in Baltimore, Maryland in November. The A Team, seniors **Samantha Reback** and **Daniel Galitsky** and juniors **Sam Deutsch** and **Josh Weaver**, won first place in the tournament. The B Team, juniors **Jonathan Marx**, **Danish Akbar** and **David Solbavarro**, placed in the top four and took home a semi-finalist plaque. The C Team, sophomores **Roy Liu** and **Jon Xia**, and freshman **Ben Koppel**, won first place in the Junior Varsity Bowl. In addition, in the individual History Bee, **Josh Weaver** won second place in the Varsity tournament while **Roy Liu** won second place in the JV tournament.
- Richard Montgomery High School senior, **Aaron Berman**, was a national award winner on the National Spanish Examinations in 2011 and also the recipient of the 2011 Junior Travel Award. Aaron traveled with a group of 32 students to Argentina where students spent almost two weeks speaking Spanish and learning about the culture.

## ACCUPLACER Assessment

Montgomery College uses the Accuplacer assessment to make placement decisions in English and Math for recent high school graduates. Seniors interested in attending Montgomery College have the opportunity to take practice and diagnostics Accuplacer assessments during the 2011-2012 school year at Richard Montgomery High School. This provides students the opportunity to practice content similar to what is tested on the official Accuplacer so that they are prepared for the Montgomery College placement test which is administered in the spring.

After practice and diagnostic assessments are completed the students will be provided with targeted interventions by staff members on the Accuplacer

Committee chaired by Mrs. Nancy Shay, English Resource Teacher. Students had the opportunity to take the practice Accuplacer on December 21 and 22.

Students interested in attending Montgomery College next year must turn in their application by the February 28<sup>th</sup> deadline in order to receive the fee waiver and be eligible to test in the spring at Richard Montgomery High School. Those who do not, will need to register online, pay the \$25 application fee, and will have to go to campus to take the official Accuplacer test. Students should contact Ms. Mary Hull, the College and Career Information Coordinator, with any questions or if they are interested in applying to enroll at Montgomery College next year.

## More School Updates

- On Saturday, November 19, 2011, over 400 students from around the state attended a Leadership Conference at Richard Montgomery High School. The conference was hosted by the Student Government Association of our school and the Maryland Association of Student Councils. Students attended workshops on a variety of topics including planning successful school events and parliamentary procedure. In addition, students heard a presentation from this year's designated charity, Save the Bay Foundation. Lastly, National Honor Society Advisor's from around the state also attended workshops.
- The SGA sponsored student staff basketball game on Friday, December 1, 2011, was a huge success, raising over \$300 for the Turkish earthquake relief fund. The student team won by two points and the teachers have requested a rematch in the spring. The SGA has also had a very successful dress drive, canned food drive and toy drive, all of which have helped the local community.
- Mr. Jon Freda, athletic director, earned his Registered Athletic Administrator (RAA), which is the first level of national certification through the National Interscholastic Athletic Administrators Association.
- Ms. Molly Clarkson, Richard Montgomery High School English teacher, was named the 2011 Laurence Bedford Holland Scholar at the Bread Loaf School of English in Middlebury, Vermont. Named for the former chair of the Department of English and scholar of Henry James at Johns Hopkins University who also taught for many years at the School of English, the scholarship recognizes a student's exemplary academic work. Ms. Clarkson was awarded the scholarship for her work on theories of religious toleration in the seventeenth-century Puritan polemical rhetoric of John Milton and Roger Williams.
- Richard Montgomery English teacher Ms. Julie Dean was selected to represent the perspective of High School English teachers across the county on the Montgomery County Education Association (MCEA) Councils on Teaching and Learning. According to the MCEA website, the charge of the Council includes providing "a vehicle for teacher discussion of, reaction to, and then communication about MCPS initiatives related to curriculum, assessment, instruction, and staff development." Ms Dean has been elected to serve on the committee for three years.
- To showcase our talented artists, we are using the gallery windows as a "Spotlight Gallery". The "Spotlight Gallery" will be for art students to display their work each month. The December artists are **Andrew Dundas** and **Elaine Bucknam**. Both Andrew and Elaine are seniors. Also, we have a rotating art show in the Principal's Conference Room. # Inclement Weather Parent Letter

January, 2012

Dear Parents and Guardians:

Winter weather emergencies, such as snow and ice, may cause disruptions in school operations, including the closure of school, a delayed opening, or an early dismissal. This letter provides information about the procedures used when such disruptions occur. Also, information is provided about the weather contingency plan that would add student instructional days to the end of the scheduled school year if schools are closed for more than four days due to excessive weather emergencies.

## **Closure of School**

When schools are closed systemwide, all instructional programs and extracurricular activities in schools are canceled. Private day-care providers in school buildings may elect to stay open if the schools are closed but the administrative offices are open. In extreme conditions, administrative offices may also be closed. If this occurs, private day-care programs located in school buildings are closed as well.

## **Delayed Opening**

A delayed opening means that schools open two hours later than scheduled. All buses operate on the same delayed schedule and, therefore, the pick-up times are two hours later than normal. When elementary schools open on a delayed schedule, the following programs are canceled—morning sessions of Head Start, prekindergarten, and other specialized programs or field trips scheduled before 10:30 a.m.; e.g., the Thomas Edison High School of Technology morning session. Activities that begin after 10:30 a.m. will be held as scheduled. Afternoon sessions of prekindergarten begin at the regular time. Parents should continue to check for radio, television, or Web announcements in the event a decision to delay the opening of schools is reconsidered and a decision to close schools for the day is made (by 7:00 a.m.).

## **Early Dismissal**

An early dismissal means that schools will close 2.5 hours earlier than scheduled. All buses operate on that same early schedule and, therefore, drop-off times are 2.5 hours earlier than normal. When elementary schools close early, afternoon prekindergarten and other early childhood programs are canceled, as well as any special programs or field trips scheduled after 10:30 a.m. Morning prekindergarten and morning half-day Head Start students will be dismissed at 10:30 a.m.

## **Public Announcements**

Information about school operations is announced publicly as soon as possible on area radio and television stations, Montgomery County Public Schools (MCPS) Cable TV (Comcast Channel 34, Verizon FIOS Channel 36, RCN Channel 89), Outlook, on the Internet at [www.montgomeryschoolsmd.org](http://www.montgomeryschoolsmd.org), and on a recorded telephone message at 301-279-3673. Emergency announcements are available by signing up for MCPS *QuickNotes* and *Alert MCPS* text and e-mail notifications on the school system's home page. If schools are closed or delayed, the announcement is made no later than 6:00 a.m. (or the night before if possible). If schools are closing early, the announcement is made by 11:00 a.m.

## **Emergency Weather Contingency Plan**

An emergency weather contingency plan will add student instructional days to the end of the scheduled school year if schools are closed more than four days because of weather emergencies. The planned school year for students ends on Tuesday, June 12, 2012. However, if schools are closed for more than four days due to weather emergencies, the following schedule would extend the school year in order to add the necessary make-up days:

1. If schools are closed for five days, the school year will be extended by one day to June 13, 2012.
2. If schools are closed for six days, the school year will be extended by two days to June 13 and June 14, 2012.
3. If schools are closed seven days, the school year will be extended by three days to June 13, June 14, and June 15, 2012.
4. If schools are closed for eight days, the school year will be extended by four days to June 13, June 14, June 15, and June 18, 2012.
5. If schools are closed nine days, the school year will be extended by five days to June 13, June 14, June 15, June 18, and June 19, 2012.

## **Weather Conditions and Decisions**

The school system uses a variety of sources of information to determine whether to close schools, delay the opening of schools, or dismiss schools early. These sources include actual physical inspection of road and school conditions by Department of Transportation officials and other staff at areas throughout the county, and an analysis of independent reports from the National Weather Service, Accu-Weather, and the news media. The most severe weather conditions within the county are used as the basis for decision making. Consistent procedures are maintained in order to respond quickly to emergency weather conditions and protect the safety and well-being of students.

All public schools within Montgomery County adhere to the same schedule relating to emergency weather conditions. The decision to change school operations is made by the superintendent of schools or his designee and affects all schools within the school system.
