Teacher and Student Jobs

Reading

Our students are beginning to learn about realistic fiction and the components that make up realistic fiction. Students will also learn how to choose a book that is on their reading level.

In the month of September students will take the MAP-R assessment in the computer lab. This will be the first of three times they will take the test. The results will be discussed at teacher/parent conferences in November.

Writing

Students will be learning the difference between "telling and showing" in writing. We begin with an idea and develop it into an interesting piece of writing. Ask your child to read a selection from their Writer's Notebook and discuss the important adjectives and sensory

words that make their writing come alive!

Math

Math Unit One continues through the end of October. In this unit students will learn about place value, data analysis, and addition and subtraction using 3 digits or more. In Ms. Maloney's class (Fourth grade advanced class) students will learn place value, data analysis, and geometry. We utilize our quiz data by displaying it in line graphs and analyzing trends which we will apply to our data analysis lessons.

Social Studies

Our students will learn about human, capital and natural resources. Given a varied group of resources, we will successfully sort and categorize each type of resource!

Science

Your child will be learning about the three different kinds of fingerprints through analysis and observation! After making their own set of fingerprints, each student will determine their personal finger print formula. We will be studying our prints using magnifying lenses and determine if we have the same fingerprints.

Parent Jobs

When reviewing math homework, it is helpful for you to ask your child to explain the steps they follow to complete each problem. If they are not getting the correct answer, you can pinpoint the difficulty and correct it or send your child's teacher a note regarding the process your child is going through. This will help guide our instruction in class.

We will be doing quarterly book talks that will require your child to read 6 or more books each quarter. Book talks are a wonderful way for you and your child to discover new types of literature.
