## Teacher and Student Jobs

### Reading

Our students are beginning to learn about BCR's this month. A

BCR or Brief Constructed Response requires students to read a passage, answer a question and use evidence from the passage to support their answer. "Go for a 4" is a favorite slogan we use to encourage students to try their best and use feedback to make improvements when needed.

During the month of September students took the MAP-R assessment in the computer lab. This was the first of three times they will take the test. The results will be discussed at teacher/parent conferences in November.

### Writing

Students have been learning the difference between "telling and showing" in writing. We begin with an idea and develop it into an interesting piece of writing. We focus on the six traits of writing (ideas, voice, conventions, word choice, sentence fluency, and organization of ideas). This month we will be focusing primarily on ideas, voice, conventions, and word choice.

### Math

Math Unit One continues through the end of October. Students are extending their place

value knowledge into the millions! We utilize our quiz data by displaying it in line graphs and analyzing trends. Many word problems involve multiple steps such as making reasonable estimates and then subtracting to find the difference. In Ms. Maloney's math class, the students have been learning about central tendency (data analysis) through a rap song called "Data Analysis". The students will be completing Unit 1 by learning about geometry concepts such as circumference, radius, and diameter. The first unit assessment in both classes will be the week of October 25<sup>th</sup>.

### **Social Studies**

Our students have learned about human, capital and natural resources. We will be learning about the differences between goods and services and how they relate to our everyday lives.

### **Science**

Students will be applying their crime solving techniques soon in a case they will be given to solve by using their knowledge about the three types of fingerprints-arch, loop, and whorl. Students will apply their techniques by analyzing fingerprint patterns as well observing "suspects" in a "crime" that has been committed.

### **Parent Jobs**

Please continue to make sure your child gets plenty of rest every night and has a good breakfast every day. Please call the school if you have questions about the breakfast menu. It's important to stay healthy during the change of seasons.

The Learning Skills Folders are quickly becoming a great means of communication between home and school. Continue to review it, initial and send back to school the next day.

Data binders have already been sent home for the first half of the quarter. If you have not seen the data binders yet, please make sure you ask your child about it. The data binders are a way for the students to keep track of their academic progress.

Please take a few minutes to review your student's completed homework and initial their assignment notebook nightly.

When reviewing math homework, it is helpful for you to ask your child to explain the steps they follow to complete each problem. If they are not getting the correct answer, you can pinpoint the difficulty and correct it or send

your child's teacher a note regarding the process your child is going through. This will help guide our instruction in class.

At this point in the 1st quarter, your child should have read and discussed 3 of the 6 books to fulfill their reading requirements. Remember, book talks are a wonderful way for you and your child to discover new types of literature.
