NON-NEGOTIABLES

1. FIGHTING

- Automatic long-term suspension
- Consideration of police referral and recommendation for expulsion

2. WEAPONS, DISTRIBUTION OF ALCOHOL OR DRUGS, PHYSICAL ATTACK ON A STUDENT OR STAFF

- 10 Day Suspension, Recommendation for Expulsion, Police Referral

3. DISRESPECT: (Profanity Directed Towards Staff; Failure to Follow a Reasonable Request; Insubordination; Failure to Provide Name)

- Automatic suspension

4. CELL PHONES

- Cell phones are not permitted to be used, seen, or heard during class.
 - 1st Offense: Friendly Reminder
 - 2nd Offense: Confiscation; conference with administrator; contract; returned the next day
 - 3rd Offense: Confiscated indefinitely; returned only through a conference with parent

5. INAPPROPRIATE DRESS

- CLOTHING that is too revealing as determined by staff
 - Friendly Reminder; Replacement Clothing; Parent Contact if needed
- HATS
 - 1st Offense: Friendly Reminder
 - 2nd Offense: Confiscation for the day
 - 3rd Offense: Confiscated indefinitely

6. LEAVING CAMPUS WITHOUT PERMISSION

- Parent Contact
- Administrative Detention/In-School Suspension
- Investigation for Suspicious Activity, Police Referral

7. TARDINESS TO CLASS

- 1st Offense: Warning
- 2nd Offense: Teacher-Assigned Detention in Writing (Brief)
- 3rd Offense: Teacher-Assigned Detention in Writing (Extended); Parent Contact/Conference
- 4th Offense: Administrative Referral for Administrative Action

**Three (3) unexcused tardies = One (1) unexcused absence; Five (5) unexcused absences= no credit for class*

**If students fail to report for teacher-assigned detention, the detention will be doubled. Failure to report for detention after that will result in administrative referral for administrative action and exclusion from school activities (see below).*

8. THEFT (of personal property, including possession of stolen items or physical contact with another person or their belongings.

- Automatic Suspension; Restitution; Police Referral

9. BULLYING REPORT

- Administrative Referral for Administrative Action, including long-term suspension and recommendation for expulsion

Students accumulating 3 or more un-served detentions and/or students failing to pay obligations will be restricted from all extra-curricular activities including, but not limited to: Homecoming/Prom Athletics; Clubs Access to athletic events, and other school productions; commencement.
