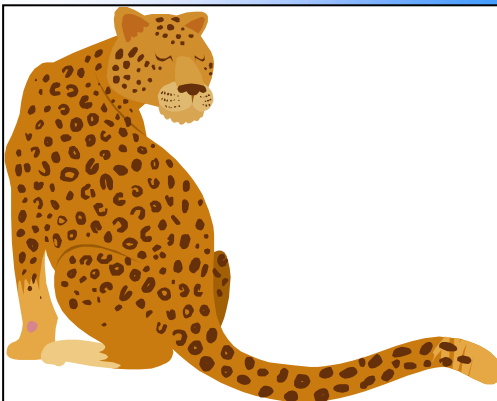


ROAR!

ROAR in Action!

Here are some examples of ROAR at JW!

Being **Respectful** means following adult directions, using appropriate language, and volume.

Showing **Organization** means bringing all materials to class and staying to the right in the hallways.

Demonstrating **Achievement** means setting goals, using time wisely, and asking questions.

Being **Responsible** means using active listening, taking ownership in actions, participating actively.

How can parents help?

When students meet our expectations, staff members **reinforce positive behaviors** with “**JW Dough**” that can be redeemed at the ROAR Store and raffles.

Parents can:

What is ROAR?

ROAR is our adaptation of a program called Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS).

There are **three main components** of PBIS:

- teaching appropriate behavior
- providing interventions when behavior expectations are not met
- recognizing students when behavior expectations are met.

PBIS is a team-based school-wide design for discipline which includes **all students, all staff, in all settings.**
