NEWS FLASH!!

MEET OUR TEAM

The third grade team is looking forward to a new and exciting year. We would like to take this opportunity to introduce ourselves. This year, Mr. Chris Higgins, Ms. Liz Hum, Ms. Anne Calabretta, and Ms. Yvonne Mar will once again make up the third grade team at Wyngate. Taryn Veith will also join the team as she is teaching third grade students in the GT/LD classroom. We have many exciting things planned for your children for this upcoming year, and we look forward to seeing you at Back-To-School-Night.

HOMework

Homework will be given four times a week. The assignments may be in math, reading/language arts, science, social studies, written expression, or spelling. These assignments are reinforcement, or enrichment, to follow up on material presented during the instructional time. As such, the work should be done independently. The time it takes students to finish homework varies, but the time a third grader spends completing homework **should not exceed 40 minutes**. If your child is having trouble with an assignment, ***please send a note to the teacher so that the problem can be addressed in class.***

Addressing homework difficulty is not a parent responsibility. What should parents do? Parents should provide a quiet place at a consistent time each day for the completion of homework. Parents should also check to see if homework is complete and placed in the appropriate section of the binder. When homework arrives at school, it will be checked together as a class and then placed in the student's binder. The goal of homework is to teach students how to be responsible and follow a routine. Therefore, students' homework assignments will not be graded. Students who do not complete their homework will remain in at recess until the assignment is completed.

It is suggested that all third graders purchase a STUDENT PLANNER from school (or another similar version) to record daily homework assignments in each day (**Students should bring a check payable for \$2.90 to Wyngate Elementary School for this student planner during the first week of school**). It is essential that students keep these assignment books in their binders at all times, and that parents check their child's assignment book each night to ensure that homework is completed.

FRIDAY FOLDERS AND PROGRESS REPORTS... COMING SOON!

If you were wondering why your child was asked to bring a pocket folder to school, well... this folder will become your child's **FRIDAY FOLDER**. In addition to completing homework, your child will be responsible for sharing the Friday Folder and **PROGRESS REPORT FOLDER** with you over the weekend. This folder will contain your child's completed work for the week. **All checked assignments in this folder should remain at home.** Long term homework assignments will be given at various times throughout the year. A student who is absent should plan a time with the teachers the day she/he returns to go over the assignments missed. This is a student responsibility. Each student will also bring home a weekly progress report. This progress report will provide parents and students with an idea of how each student is progressing in regard to learning skills. It is our hope that through these weekly progress reports, students become more aware of the impact that the learning skills have on their academic success. Progress reports should be reviewed, signed, and returned the following Monday. Look for progress reports to begin in mid September.

DATA NOTEBOOKS

Third grade students will be keeping track of their academic progress in data notebooks. They will be able to analyze their progress in the areas of math, reading, and spelling. Therefore, students will be able to continue to work towards improving in all areas. These data notebooks will be sent home periodically so parents are kept informed about their child's progress as well. More detailed information will be provided for parents at Back-to-School Night.

EMPHASIS ON WRITING

Again this year, third graders will have writing as a separate subject from reading. Although writing will also occur during reading class, it will not be the emphasis. Writing will take place three to four times throughout the week. This year the third grade teachers are going to be keeping writing portfolios for each student. What does this mean for work coming home? Because using feedback is one of the learning skills on a student's report card, we feel that it's important for the students to keep all their previously graded writing papers in a portfolio to use when completing a new writing piece. Therefore, writing pieces will be kept in the classroom. These pieces will be shared during conference time, and will be available for parents to look through by contacting the teacher to set up a convenient time. As with all other subjects, you will be notified if the teacher feels that your child is struggling in a particular area.

MORNING LINE-UP

As Ms. Leister mentioned in *The Wednesday Monthly*, morning line-up will always be inside this year due to the large population the school currently has. Please have your children keep a book or two in their backpacks to read during morning line-up each day. With so many students in the hallway, having a book to read will help maintain order in the morning and afternoon while students are waiting. We will also speak with students about this matter.
