Subject: Readiness for Schools

During the Readiness for Schools discussion on August 24, 2023, Board members requested the following information.

Question:

Ms. Rivera-Oven requested information regarding the summer program. She would like a better understanding of how many students are in the classrooms. Please include a breakdown by school/district and then disaggregate by school level (ES, MS, HS).

Response:

In response to the Board inquiry during the Board meeting on August 24, 2023, regarding student access to in-person and virtual local summer school programs—Summer 2023, the requested information follows.

Students had access to in-person and virtual local summer school programs. Identified students who receive special education services attend Extended School Year services, and elementary school students in Title I schools participated in Extended Learning Opportunities. More than 31,000 students participated in all summer school programs. Students at elementary and middle school levels were clustered. Each high school provided its own local program. In addition, the Central High School Summer Program was available to all high school students for both original credit and credit recovery.

Local Summer School Programs

Elementary Schools

- 4,025 students participated in local summer school programs, at 39 elementary schools.
- Some sites housed more than one school for a combined summer program.
- Instruction focused on English language arts and math.

Locations: Wheaton and Seneca Valley HS

Enrollment by Session:

- Session 1: 86 students
- Session 2: 112 students

Format: Hybrid by course

- Virtual class on Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays and Fridays
- In-person learning on Wednesdays
- The Law, Gov., Public Safety and Admin Guided Research course integrated in-person experiential learning opportunities at the Montgomery County Courthouse and Library of Congress in Washington, DC
- Internship and apprenticeship experiences were in-person

CTE courses included:

- Foundations of Medical Science
- Introduction to Engineering Design

Extended School Year

MCPS offers specialized support for students with disabilities who qualify for the extended school year. These students receive support for their individualized education plan during their summer learning. Enrollment: 3,386 students

Extended Learning Opportunities

All current and future enrolled students are invited to join the summer program at their Title I school. There are currently 37 Title I schools. This program targets key learning from Montgomery County Public Schools curriculum to prepare all students for the upcoming school year. Enrollment: 7,084 students.
