### The first day of school for students in Kindergarten through Grade 5 is Monday, August 28th

The instructional day for students begins at 9:25 a.m. and ends at 3:50 p.m. Students arriving after the 9:25 a.m. bell are considered tardy and must be signed in by an adult at the front office. In the morning, students are admitted to classrooms at 9:15 a.m. Students should not be dropped off at school before 9:10 a.m. There will be no supervision for students before that time.

#### Students in Grades 1-5:

When students come to school on Monday, August 28, they should report directly to their classroom. There will be extra staff in the hallways to help direct students.

### Students in Kindergarten:

The first week of school, staff members will greet the children attending kindergarten at all entrance doors and take them to the gym. Kindergarten teachers will then walk the students to the classroom. Your child will be given a name tag to wear each day the first week. Please help us by putting it on at home each morning. To allow for the establishment of routines, parents will not be permitted into the gym or classrooms the first day of school.



Join our incoming Kindergarten families for a playdate on August 26th at 4:00 p.m. on the RCV playground. You will have a chance to meet other families and make connections before school begins. Thank you to the RCV PTA for putting together this event!



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
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### **Rock Creek Valley Parent Handbook**

### **ATTENDANCE/ABSENCES**

The Maryland State Department of Education has clarified that ALL school absences MUST be accounted for with a written note or else be counted as unexcused. Parents are requested to call the school in the morning if their child is not going to attend school that day and follow up with a note when the student returns to school. When you call to report an absence, please leave your child's name, his/her teacher, and the reason for the absence. \*\* Students are not permitted in school with fevers of 100° or higher. Students must be fever – free and vomit-free for 24 hours before returning to school. Students will be permitted, to the extent possible and at the discretion of the teacher, to make up work missed during the period of an **excused** absence.

Attendance at school is extremely important. Research shows that there is a significant relationship between consistent attendance and academic achievement. The Maryland State Department of Education has established standards for school attendance, including both lawful and unlawful absences. As part of the Maryland School Assessment Program, all schools in the state of Maryland are monitored and evaluated on their attendance records. Students are expected to attend school regularly and be punctual.

- Students will be recorded as *a.m. absent* if they arrive at school more than two hours late.
- Students will be recorded as *p.m. absent* if they leave school more than two hours early.
- Students will be recorded as either *a.m. absent* or *p.m. absent* if they are absent from school for more than two hours, but less than four hours during the school day.
- Students will be recorded as *full-day absent* if they are present for less than two hours of the school day.
- Students will be recorded as *full-day present* if they are present for more than four hours of the school day.

If your child is absent, tardy or needs to be dismissed early, please send a note explaining the reason. This information is necessary for attendance coding purposes. Vacation trips are not considered excused or "lawful" absences. According to State regulations, the following is a listing of "lawful" absences for elementary students:

- Death in the immediate family
- Illness of the student
- Court summons
- Hazardous weather conditions
- Observance of a religious holiday
- State emergency
- Suspension
- Lack of authorized transportation
- Other emergencies

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### **BICYCLES ETC**



Students may ride a bicycle to school if written permission letter is sent to the office. A lock is needed in order to properly secure the bike to our rack. The school cannot assume responsibility for damaged or stole bicycles. It is important that parents review bicycle safety and etiquette. Bicycles are to be "walked" on school property. Please remember that Montgomery County law requires that all children 18 years of age or younger wear bicycle helmets.

### **BIRTHDAYS**

Student birthdays at Rock Creek Valley will be called on the morning announcements. Each student will receive a birthday pencil from the main office. Birthday balloons, food (cupcakes, cake, etc.), and parties will not be permitted due to allergy concerns and the impact on the instructional program. If you would like to send in invitations to birthday parties, outside of the school day, we ask that you send in enough for all students in the class.



### **Bus Schedule**



Please read the enclosed schedule to determine the best (safest) stop for your child. For the first few days, it is wise to be prepared for minor delays as the new routes are established. If there is a safety question, please call us. We will have a crossing guard at the crosswalk immediately in front of Rock Creek Valley from 8:55-9:25 a.m. and 3:40-4:10 p.m.

### **CELL PHONES/SMART WATCHES**

Rock Creek Valley students are discouraged from bringing portable communication devices on school grounds during the instructional day. Any cell phones or other portable devices brought to school must remain in the student's backpack throughout the day. The school is not responsible for lost or damaged phones. If a cell phone or other device becomes a distraction, a parent or guardian will be notified and will need to collect the device from the main office.



### **CLASS PARTIES**

Class parties are held twice during the school year for special celebrations: Fall Festival and Valentine's Day. Parents who do not wish for their child to participate in these or other celebrations, should notify the classroom teacher of their preference. Please do not send in ANY food items for these parties, including valentines.



### **DISCIPLINE POLICY**

A Student Discipline Policy will be sent home with each child. Parents are asked to read and discuss this policy with their child so that students can continue to work in a safe and comfortable learning environment.

### DISMISSAL

Students who walk home dismiss from the main front doors by the atrium. Parents should make a line by the intercom to give their number, and then move back by the flagpole. If your child in grades 3-5 will be an independent walker, please send a note to their teacher. Please remind any older children picking up siblings that ball playing, tag, and other games are not safe in front of our building during dismissal.

**Students who are car riders will dismiss from the APR.** If you already have a car rider number, it will remain the same for this year. If you are a new family, or now require a number for another reason, Mrs. Velasquez will be assigning numbers during Open House on August 25. You can also contact her by email or phone the week of August 21-25, if you will not be present at Open House.

### **DROPPING STUDENTS OFF AT SCHOOL**



The parent drop-off area has been provided just outside of the school's side entrance. Parents who drop their child off at school or pick their child up in the afternoon should do so in that area. No cars are allowed in the bus circle (directly in front of the school) during arrival and dismissal. We request that all drivers remain with their vehicles unless parked in marked spaces and that no car be left to block the free flow of traffic entering the parking and drop off area. If a student is late, an adult must walk the student into the main office and sign them in.

### EARLY DISMISSALS

School is occasionally dismissed early due to adverse weather conditions, or mechanical failure (electricity, water) at the school. Please discuss with your child how they will go home in the event of an early dismissal to eliminate the need for them to have to call home. Early dismissals are announced on local media stations. Planned early release days are listed in the school calendar.

### FOOD POLICY

As a result of the number of students with food allergies and sensitivities, Rock Creek Valley will adjust our food policy for the 2023-2024 school year. Our PTA will continue to provide goody bags with pre-approved snacks, drink, and activities for our two parties. We are asking that parents do not send in ANY food items. This includes with valentines or for any other event.

### HEALTH ROOM

A health technician is on duty from 9:00 am to 4:00 pm each school day. It is important for us to have every child's emergency information on file so that we may contact parents quickly if necessary. If your home, cell, or work telephone number changes, please let us know. Students who become ill at school may be picked up in the Health Room connected to the Main Office. Please feel free to contact Ms. Buxton, RCV's Health Technician, at 240.740.1240.



### LOST AND FOUND

A lost and found area is located outside of the All Purpose Room for items that have been misplaced by students. Twice a year unclaimed items will be donated to a local charity. Parents and students will be reminded and encouraged to check for missing items before the donation date.

### MEALS

You can apply now online for Free and Reduced Priced Meals (FARMS) at <u>www.MySchoolApps.com.</u> The online application is quick and easy, and must be done each school year. Beginning school year 2022-2023, students who qualify for reduced-price meals will not be charged that cost - meaning that <u>reduced-price students will eat for free</u>!

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### **MEDICATIONS**

Parents are encouraged to administer medications to their children at home whenever possible. <u>No medication will be administered in school or during school-sponsored activities without written authorization from the parent/guardian and a physician's written order</u>. Any prescribed medication that needs to be administered at school must be in the original bottle and must be accompanied by MCPS form 525-13 (Authorization to Administer Prescribed Medication). All medications must be hand delivered to the school by a parent. Under no circumstances will school personnel administer medications brought to school by a student. Over-the-counter medications must be accompanied by a physician's note to be administered by the health technician. Please do not send cough drops, throat drops, vitamins, etc. to school with your child. Please feel free to contact Ms. Buxton, RCV's Health Technician, directly at 240.740.1240.

### **OFFICE HOURS**

The school office is open from 8:30 am until 4:30 pm each school day. An answering machine will take messages during non-school hours.

### **PARENT COMMUNICATIONS**

Regular communications from the school should be expected to arrive home with the students in the orange communication folder. These will include teachers' notices and announcements as appropriate. A bilingual email message will be sent to parents weekly, on Sunday evenings, through our Connect Ed system.

### **PICKING STUDENTS UP FROM SCHOOL**

Once students have arrived at school, they will be released only to their parents, guardians or other adults authorized in advance. All students leaving school before the end of the school day, must be signed out from the main office. If parents want their child to be picked up at school at any time by anyone else, including siblings and grandparents, the parents must send a note to the school stating their wishes and the name of the person who will pick up the child. The person picking up the child must present picture identification to the school office.

In order to maintain safety at the end of the instructional day, please avoid picking up students for early dismissal after 3:30 p.m.





### SCHOOLCASH ONLINE

Montgomery County Public Schools has transitioned to a new online payment system called SchoolCash Online as its preferred method of payment for school-related fees such as fundraisers, field trips, obligations, etc. (Please note that the new payment system is NOT related to school cafeteria accounts)

SchoolCash Online helps parents/guardians and community members pay school-related fees safely, quickly, and easily. SchoolCash Online will help increase efficiency and security at schools by making payments directly into schools' bank accounts and eliminating the need for teachers to handle money. In addition, once registered, you will be immediately informed about school activities!

Powered by KEV Group, SchoolCash Online is the industry leader in the management of school fees. The new system puts all of the school-related fees online for purchase so users can make purchases online using a credit card or e-check. ### SCHOOL HOURS

#### We request that students NOT bring their personal toys, balls, stuffed animals, trading cards, electronic games etc. to school. We cannot be responsible for these items and they are not needed for the instructional program or recess.

### VISITORS

ہ **WELCOME** 

MCPS Policy requires that all visitors, without exception, must check in with the Front Office staff before proceeding into the building. This policy is enforced for the safety of the students. Visitors sign in and obtain a sticker from the visitor Management System (VMS). Parents bringing items for their child (lunch, band instruments, homework, etc.) will be asked to leave the items with front office personnel so that instructional time remains uninterrupted. We, at RCV, have an open door policy, as long as current health and safety protocols allow for classroom visitors. We encourage families to notify the teacher of your desire to visit in order to promote the smooth flow of the instructional program.
